

Construction began in late March to replace the waterline main in Main Street between Old Canyon Road (approx. 650 South) and 600 North. This project is scheduled to be completed before June 1st, at which time UDOT will begin road construction. A detailed description of the Main Street reconstruction project is available on our website, www.tooelecity.org.

During construction, the intent is to keep one lane of traffic open in each direction through construction areas, but we are asking citizens to be patient and to plan ahead. Please use alternative routes when possible. We have highlighted several roads that could be possible North-South alternate routes.


