**Area #2** All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.


**Area #3** All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.


## Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills. If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn—contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

FIREWORKS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE FOLLOWING GENERAL AREAS:

- North of 2200 North and West of Main Street (SR-36)
- North of 1600 North and East of Main Street (SR-36)
- South of Skyline Drive
- East of Droubay Road
- West of 1000 West

The Tooele City Fire Dept. appreciates your assistance in creating a safe environment this summer holiday season. Please have a happy and safe 4<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of July and stay away from dangerous and illegal fireworks. For more info. visit <u>www.looelefire.org</u>. Fireworks may be discharged 3 days before and 3 days after the holiday (July 1—July 7 and July 21—July 27) between the hours of 11 am and 11 pm. Hours extended on July 4th and July 24th until midnight. For those who live in restricted areas, you may light off fireworks at Elton Park or the Dow James Park parking lots on July 4th.

#### NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and main-

tained to under 6 inches in height. The property owner is responsible for the park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot(s). Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a 15 foot break of weeds cut and maintained under 6 inches, from adjacent lots inward.
