Members of the Tooele City Council, department heads, staff, and residents of Tooele City; it is an honor and a pleasure for me to stand before you this evening to present the annual State of the City address.

During the past several weeks, I have made an effort to meet with all employees of the City. These individuals are exceptional people who are willing to not only do their jobs each day, but they are aware that they are serving the public.

The main purpose of local government is to provide services to the people. These service include bringing clean water to your home and taking the dirty water away. 

Poison Prevention Week is March 18th-24th! Each year, over 50,000 calls are received by the Utah Poison Control Center. More than 60% of the exposures involve children less than six years of age.

1-800-222-1222 In 2010, 94% of all poisonings occurred in the home. Fortunately 79% were managed on site with tele-

phone follow-up. Therefore, it is critical to safeguard the home environment. The Utah Poison Control Center reminds everyone to make poisoning prevention a year-round responsibility.

The top three poison categories in children involve: (1). Cosmetics and personal care products, (2). Household cleaning products, (3). Pain killers such as acetaminophen and ibuprofen.

The top three poison categories in adults involve: (1). Pain killers including narcotics and over-the-counter analgesics, (2). Sedatives (drugs to reduce anxiety) and hypnotics (sleep aids), (3). Antidepressants.

TRASH/DEBRIS ITEMS:

Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner.

Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of

Tooele City code states these will be deemed a nuisance: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety:

INOPERABLE/UNLICENSED/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Only two inoperable/unlicensed motor vehicles may be kept and must be placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.

Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) of Tooele City code states such vehicles will be deemed a nuisance: (a) junked, wrecked, or inoperable motor vehicles upon real property, for longer than 72 house, except that up to 2 such vehicles or parts thereof may be stored within an enclosed building or completely screened by a sight-obscuring fence. (d) Abandoned motor vehicles.
