

### Additional transit in the Tooele Valley: How would new resources from Proposition 16 be invested?

UTA has been busy over the past several years improving transit for the residents of the Tooele Valley. This November, Tooele Valley residents will vote on an additional sales tax measure which would be used for additional transit within and connecting to the communities of Tooele, Grantsville, Lake Point, Stansbury Park, and Erda. This will be identified on voters' ballots as Proposition 16.

UTA, along with local community leaders, is developing a plan for how these new resources could be used to improve the transit options for stakeholders in the Tooele Valley. These alternatives offer better transit commute options connecting to jobs and activity centers in the Salt Lake Valley and beyond, as well as more options to travel within the Tooele Valley and the growing number of housing and community centers.

Some of the options may include expanded coverage (more frequent all-day service to SLC, weekend service, additional destinations), new transit programs (mobility on demand, volunteer driver programs, additional flex routes), and potential long-term projects (BRT, Rail).


#### FREE SOIL ADDITIVE FOR LAWNS, PLANTS, & GARDENS!

Tooele City is giving away biosolids to anyone interested! Several years ago the City constructed upgrades to its wastewater treatment facility to create a state of the art treatment facility using a process unparalleled in this country. The facility is a full reuse facility meaning nearly every drop that enters the facility is treated and can be reused. Now you have an opportunity to benefit further from this effort. On Saturday, October 20, 2018, the City will make its biosolids available to the public at NO COST from 8:00 am-12:00 pm. The only limit is the size of the container you bring with you. Biosolids are not what you think. Biosolids are not human waste. Biosolids are the residual byproduct of the treatment process. Since it is made up of organic matter as well as beneficial levels of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium, it makes an excellent soil addition. The City's state of the art treatment process produces Class "A" bio-solids which is the highest quality product available, making it viable for general purpose use without the need for mulching or mixing with other material to help lawns, plants, and gardens grow stronger. Anyone interested in getting biosolids can do so on October 20<sup>th</sup> at the Tooele City Water Reclamation Facility, 3300 North 1200 West. To get to the facility go west on Erda Way from SR-36 for approximately 2 miles, turn south on 1200 West and go approximately one mile. The Water Reclamation Facility is on the left next to the City Animal Shelter. Staff will be available on-site to direct you to the biosolids for loading. For questions, please call 435-843-2132.

## Tree Maintenance

While trees and vegetation contribute to the beauty of our neighborhoods and community, they may also create unintended obstacles and hazards when not maintained properly. Trees that hang over the street or over the sidewalk can create nuisances and in some cases hazards. Please maintain the trees on your property, particularly the trees in the park strips, to make sure your trees are not creating some of these obstacles:

- Obstructed snowplow, garbage truck & large vehicle clearance;
- Blocked mailboxes;
- Blocked sidewalks:

TRASH/DEBRIS:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) states trash/debris will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures

upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety. Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner.

Tooele City provides a BULK WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month based on your regular trash pick up day. There is no additional cost to use this program. Please do not put items for bulk waste out on the curb more than 24 hours in advance. If you have items for bulk waste pickup, please call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 to get on the schedule. You can find the pick-up schedule and more information on our website tooelecity.org.

#### INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.
