COVID-19 Updates: City Hall will reopen to the public on June 1st. The Pratt Aquatic Center plans a soft re-opening on June 1st with limited capacity and schedules for classes and lessons are still being planned. The City Library will be opening soon with modified hours and operations. Parks and playgrounds are open. Social distancing is still recommended. Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users north of Vine and west of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users north of Vine and east of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users south of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.


If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

June 30 Primary Election Information

Ballots for the upcoming Primary Election will be coming to your mailbox the 2nd week in June. I can't express how important it is that you vote the ballot that comes to you. Please vote and mail your ballot or get it into a ballot drop box as soon as you can. Once the ballot gets to the Clerk's Office it has to sit for 3 days before we can process it due to Covid-19. To protect everyone, there have been other changes as well:

- * The last day to register or update an address by any method is June 19th.
- $\ast~$ There will be no Early Voting for this election.
- * There will be no in-person polling locations.
- * On Election Day there will be a mobile polling location at the County Building. This will be for the disabled, for those who did not receive a ballot, and for emergencies only. If you did not get a ballot due to your address being incorrect, you will not be allowed to vote.
- * There are only two ballots available for this election: The Republican Party ballot and a non-artisan School Board Ballot for those living in School Board District #1.
- * If you are a registered Republican, a ballot will be sent to you.
- * Unaffiliated voters who want to vote the Republican Ballot will have to affiliate with the party by June 19th.

We will do everything we can to help you vote, however, we are bound by the law. Please vote the ballot you receive in the mail. If you have moved, re-register before the June 19th deadline. Questions? Please contact me at <u>mgillette@tooeleco.org</u> or 435-843-3148.

DRINKING WATER SOURCE PROTECTION The Tooele City Water Quality Report is available for your review, and has been mailed to all water utility account holders within the City. The Report is also available on the City's web page at the following link: https://tooelecity.org/city-departments/public-works/water-department/water-quality-reports/ Fri. We are pleased to inform you that your drinking water continues to meet all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and State drinking water health standards.

Tooele City vigilantly safeguards its water supplies by:

- Establishing drinking water source protection zones for each of the City's sources,
- Adoption of City Ordinance and reliance of County Ordinance which regulate potential hazards to the City's drinking water sources, and
- Collecting and analyzing water quality data to evaluate watershed protection efforts.

You can help by:

- •Read and follow usage guidelines on detergents, fertilizers and pesticides,
- •Do your part to prevent runoff into the storm drain system,
- Properly dispose of household products such as cleaners, oil or gasoline and unused medicines,
- Continue your water conservation efforts, and;
- •When you notice someone else contaminating the water, remind them that "We all live downstream."

CENSUS 2020—A COMPLETE COUNT—EVERYONE NEEDS TO BE COUNTED! The 2020 Census is easier to take than ever before. For the first time, it can be done in minutes online including on your phone. The census can also be completed easily by phone or mail. However you decide to complete it, be sure to be counted. You matter. Your information is required by law and your information is protected.

- 2. Call by phone 844-330-2020
- 3. Send questionnaire by mail

Beginning in June, census field workers may begin making door-to-door visits to people who have not completed the survey. The census plays a part in every day for Utahns from education and roads to healthcare and politics. The

outcome of the census can determine electoral representation down to the local level, including school boards and city councils. Infrastructure decisions and funding, from road repairs to transit development, use information based on census counts. Public safety uses these numbers to guide decisions about service areas, fire stations, police precincts and hospitals. The census impacts every part of life in Utah, so be counted because you matter. For more information visit census2020.utah.gov.

Fireworks Restrictions 2020
