

A traffic signal has finally been installed at 1000 North (SR112) and 600 West! I have been working with UDOT for the past two years to get this signal installed. Although it is a temporary signal, it is up and working. As always, traffic signals allow traffic to move efficiently from all four sides of the intersection, but it will not stop accidents if drivers do not pay attention or follow the rules. A permanent plan for this intersection will include additional lanes. When this plan is completed by UDOT and funding is secured, the intersection will be completed. I appreciate your patience as this takes time. 1000 North (SR112) is a state road and not controlled by Tooele City. My staff and I have spent many hours in meetings and communicating through phone and emails to work with UDOT on this project. I

have been impatient at times at the slow process, but I am grateful that our requests were heard.

A four way stop has recently been put into place on Coleman and 200 South. Many children cross this intersection to attend schools in the area. The intersection has been marked with four crosswalks and flags for pedestrians to hold as they cross. Please be attentive in this area and watch for pedestrians. There are more intersections in our city that are being considered for all way stops to help keep pedestrians safe.

I hope that our residents will take the time to come downtown to see the buffaloes! The artwork is phenomenal and we appreciate the sponsors of the four that have been completed. The project will continue for the next few months with six additional buffaloes. The funds generated from the sponsorship of the buffaloes will be used to improve the Downtown Area.



TOOELE CITY PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT PROJECT UPDATES

SETTLERS PARK contracts are in place to begin construction on a new restroom facility at the park. This project is anticipated to be complete by the Fall.

WIGWAM PARK is still under construction. We want to thank the Rotary Club and BSA Troop 314 who planted 36 trees and Rio Tinto who donated the funds for the drip system. We are waiting for picnic tables to come in and still working on the parking lot and landscaping. The pavilion will be available for reservations this Fall.

ENGLAND ACRES construction is still ongoing. Irrigation is being installed for the athletic field. Work on the trail has begun and part of the trail has been completed. The trail begins in the park and extends from 1000 North in the park, then crosses 7th Street where it continues along the Middle Canyon Ditch to Smelter Road. The playground is still being installed, please do not go into the fenced area as safety/fall protection is not complete. We anticipate that the playground will be open this Fall. The dog park is also under construction and is anticipated to be complete this Fall.

ELTON PARK the new playground has been installed and kids of all ages have already been there to play and enjoy the new playground! We are still waiting on parts to come in for the swing and then the playground will be complete.

18 HOLE DISC GOLF at Dow James Complex is now playable! Download the UDisc App (available for Apple and Android users), and search for the Tooele City Course to see the course map. No reservation needed. Open during park hours (6 a.m.— 11 p.m.). There are no lights along the course. You must bring your own disc.

SOON TO COME at Dow James Complex. As part of an Eagle Scout project, a short 9 hole Foot Golf and Disc Golf Combo Course will be installed. This is in addition to the 18 hole disc course already available at the complex.

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Tooele City Water Consumption Rate Schedule

The Tooele City rate schedule for water consumption promotes conservation for our customers. Water is billed monthly on an increasing rate schedule (provided below).

Water Charges - The water bill charge is a combination of two fees on your monthly billing:

1. Base fee dependent upon meter size.

<u>Size</u>	Base Fee
3/4"	\$10.00
1"	\$15.00
1½"	\$22.50
2"	\$30.00
3"	\$37.50
4"-6"	\$45.00

2. Water usage fee per unit (One unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or approx. 750 gallons).

<u>Usage</u>	Per Unit
0-10 units	\$0.75 per unit
11-30 units	\$1.00 per unit
31-50 units	\$1.25 per unit
51-70 units	\$1.50 per unit
71-90 units	\$1.75 per unit
91 + units	\$2.00 per unit

BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED IN TOOELE CITY:

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call the Tooele City Business License Specialist at 435-843-2110 for more information or go to tooelecity.org and choose DEPARTMENTS>BUSINESS LICENSING from the menu for business info in Tooele City limits.

INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2023 BLUE Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and

maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecity.org. You may also contact the Tooele City Code Enforcement Officer at 435-882-8900 if you have questions or for more information.



Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code 8-6-13 states "All building sewers, including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner". Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code 9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main

line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box". Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate citizens on this? Check with your homeowners insurance to inquire if your policy covers these types of repairs. There are private companies who offer this type of insurance coverage if your homeowners insurance does not. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130.
