

In an effort to do our part in water conservation, we have removed the grass around City Hall and replaced it with more water-efficient landscaping. Jensen Family Landscaping was the low bid on this project and they did a fantastic job! I invite you to come to City Hall to see the rockscape, waterwise plants, and the buffalo. We have plans to do more in the future





Get Paid to Remove Your Lawn! Tooele City participated in the Utah Water Saver's Landscape Incentive Program, which offers up to \$3 per square foot of lawn you replace with

water-efficient landscaping. Landscaping project options include park strip, side yard, and full yard conversions. Commercial projects, irrigation retrofit, and tree-planting incentives are also available in certain areas. Find eligibility requirements, application steps, and apply for the landscape incentive program online at utahwatersavers.com. You can also find rebates for other water saving programs as well.

Why would utahwatersavers.com pay you to remove grass? According to their website, "Less water used on landscaping leaves more for our lakes and reservoirs. Since 2000, Utah's population has increased by almost 48% and is projected to increase by another 49% by 2050. This growth will convert some agricultural lands into urban/ suburban areas and will increase the density of our current urban regions. Because of this growth, many of our water basins will primarily provide for residential areas rather than agricultural ones. Therefore, it is crucial for Utah's economy, environment and health that each person conserve water—even during good water years."

I am proud that Tooele City took the steps required to be eligible and to participate in these programs.

I also hope you are enjoying the beautiful flowers that have been planted at City Hall and in the Historic Main Street area! I encourage you to visit the downtown area to see the flowers, the buffalo, the businesses, and all the Historic Main Street has to offer!



TOOELE CITY PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT PROJECT UPDATES

Tooele City is continually making improvements to our infrastructure. In addition to daily maintenance on City infrastructure, the following is a list of current and upcoming Public Works projects. If you have questions about these projects, please call the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this important work!

- ⇒ 100 East 1000 North Traffic Signal: Work began in July on installation of a new traffic light at 100 East 1000 North. Roadway improvements and new striping will also be part of this project. Traffic delays in the area will be expected during construction.
- ⇒ Aaron Drive and Berra Boulevard: A treatment called high density mineral bond was applied in July to Aaron Drive and Berra Boulevard. This is a first in Tooele City. Mineral bond is an effective asphalt preservation on residential roadways without some of the effects of chip seals or slurry seals. It is specifically engineered to preserve the native asphalt binder and prevent oxidative damage. As a result, streets are expected to last longer at less cost.
- ⇒ All-Way Stops: A four-way stop was installed at 7th Street and Upland Drive and at 100 East 400 North. A four-way stop will be installed soon at the intersection of Coleman and Vine Street.
- ⇒ Berra Boulevard and 2000 North Round-a-bout: Construction will begin soon to remove old asphalt and replace with new. New striping and signage will also be part of this project.
- ⇒ <u>Droubay Road Widening Project</u>: Construction continues on this project which will include road widening, curb, gutter, sidewalk, lighting, and a walking/biking path on Droubay Road between Vine Street and Smelter Road.
- ⇒ Flashing pedestrian signals (RRFB): Flashing Pedestrian Signals were recently installed on Vine Street at approximately 300 West near Tooele High School and Tooele Junior High School. Please watch for pedestrians crossing in that area, especially when school starts this month!
- ⇒ Roadwork Projects: There are several cul-de-sacs that are scheduled to be roto-milled and asphalted and several roads on the schedule for chip seal. These projects will begin late August to early September.
- ⇒ Vine Street Sidewalk: New curb, gutter, and sidewalk will soon be installed on Vine Street near the Oquirrh Hills ballfield (approximately 559 East Vine Street).

OUTDOOR WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

<u>Tooele City Water</u> Consumption Rate Schedule

The Tooele City rate schedule for water consumption promotes conservation for our customers. Water is billed monthly on an increasing rate schedule (provided below).

<u>Water Charges</u> - The water bill charge is a combination of two fees on your monthly billing:

1. Base fee dependent upon meter size.

1"	\$16.09
1½"	\$24.16
2"	\$32.18
3"	\$40.22
4"-6"	\$48.26

2. Water usage fee per unit (One unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or approx. 750 gallons).

0-10 units	\$0.77 per unit
11-30 units	\$1.02 per unit
31-50 units	\$1.28 per unit
51-70 units	\$1.53 per unit
71-90 units	\$1.79 per unit
91 + units	\$2.04 per unit

BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED IN TOOELE CITY:

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call the Tooele City Business License Specialist at 435-843-2110 for more information or go to tooelecity.gov and choose BUSINESS>BUSINESS LICENSES from the menu for business info in Tooele City limits.

INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2024 YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and

maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecity.gov. You may also contact a Tooele City Code Enforcement Officer at 435-882-8900 if you have questions or for more information.



Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code 8-6-13 states "All building sewers, including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner". Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code 9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main

line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box". Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate citizens on this? Check with your homeowners insurance to inquire if your policy covers these types of repairs. There are private companies who offer this type of insurance coverage if your homeowners insurance does not. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130.
