THE COUNCIL'S CORNER BY COUNCIL MEMBER JUSTIN BRADY

As you drive around Tooele, the landscape is increasingly dotted with promising signs of economic growth and development. Over recent years, Tooele City has made substantial investments in economic development, and the results are becoming evident. Among the most anticipated projects is the construction of the first building at the 1000 North and Main Street project. The emergence of two new hotels adds further momentum to our economic growth, with one situated on the corner of 1000 North and 200 West, and the other located at 2400 North near the North Pointe Medical offices. The industrial zones on the southwest of the City are experiencing remarkable expansion. Several manufacturing companies have embarked on the construction of multimillion-dollar projects, promising to usher in high-paying job opportunities for our residents. This surge in industrial development demonstrates the Council's commitment to providing avenues for sustainable employment opportunities in our community. We continue to discuss and prepare for future commercial development opportunities north of 2400 North. Economic growth will bring more than jobs for our residents. Commercial properties generally have a higher assessed value compared to residential properties, meaning they contribute more revenue per unit to the tax base. This increased revenue can help alleviate the tax burden on residential property owners and provide a more equitable distribution of tax responsibility across the community. Public Works Project Updates

A lot is happening around Tooele City! In addition to managing the City's vehicle fleet, water, streets, sewer, and storm water systems on a daily basis, the following is a list of current and upcoming

summer Public Works projects. If you have questions about these projects or any other projects you see happening in the City, please call the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this important work!

- 100 East 1000 North Traffic Signal: Work will begin soon on installation of a new traffic light at 100 East 1000 North. Roadway improvements and new striping will also be part of this project.
- All-Way Stops: A four-way stop has already been installed at 7th Street and Upland Drive; a four-way stop will be installed soon at 100 East 400 North; and a four-way stop will be installed soon at Coleman and Vine Street.
- Droubay Road Widening Project: This project is ongoing and will include road widening, curb, gutter, sidewalk, lighting, and a walking/ biking path on Droubay Road between Vine Street and Smelter Road.
- Flashing pedestrian signals (RRFB): Flashing Pedestrian Signals were recently installed on Vine Street at approximately 300 West near Tooele High School and Tooele Junior High School. Please watch for pedestrians crossing in that area, especially when school starts again in the fall.
- Vine Street Sidewalk: New curb, gutter, and sidewalk will soon be installed on Vine Street near the Oquirrh Hills ballfield (approximately 559 East Vine Street.

We spend thousands of tax payer dollars each year to repair vandalism and clean up graffiti. Tooele City offers a \$250 REWARD for information that leads to the arrest of the person(s) responsible for graffiti or vandalism. RENAMING TOOELE CITY'S DOWNTOWN ALLIANCE TO TOOELE CITY HISTORIC MAIN STREET COMMISSION

On October 6, 2021, the City Council approved a resolution acknowledging Mayor Winn's reconstitution of the City's Tooele Downtown Alliance, and acknowledging her appointments of Alliance committee members. In 2021 Tooele City was designated a Utah Main Street community with the purpose of revitalizing the downtown area, Main Street, and the Broadway area. The Utah Main Street Program works frequently with and through the City's Tooele Downtown Alliance for funding, training, and activities. Under the direction of the City's Downtown Alliance improvements included murals, buffalo statues, and beautification projects such as flowers and downtown decorating.

In 2023, individual downtown business owners created a Utah nonprofit corporation also named the Tooele Downtown Alliance, and obtained recognition of its IRS 501(c)(3) status. For the purposes of clearly delineating the Main Street Program membership and responsibilities, avoiding confusion in budgeting, obtaining grants and other funding, conducting activities, attending meetings, and making committee appointments, the City Administration recommends renaming the City's Tooele Downtown Alliance the Tooele City Historic Main Street Commission.



On June 5, 2024, the Tooele City Council approved a resolution to rename Tooele City's Downtown Alliance the **Tooele City Historic Main Street Commission** to clearly separate the two entities [the City and the non-profit 501(c) (3)].
