The Fire Department plans to make this an annual event, and we invite you to participate next year as we continue to honor those who gave their lives on that fateful day. We will never forget.



Tooele City is excited to announce that we have received the Healthy Utah Community designation by Get Healthy Utah! This designation is awarded to municipalities throughout Utah who are actively working to improve the health of their community. Tooele City was recognized as a Healthy Utah Community at the Utah League of Cities and Towns annual conference in September 2024. To receive the designation, communities must submit a letter of commitment, organize a health coalition, identify health strategies, and develop a community health plan.

Tooele City is working hard to provide its residents with fun opportunities to live a healthy lifestyle. Over the past few years, we have added new pickleball courts and skate nights. We recently expanded the England Acres walking and biking trail, and we are in the process of building a fun, ninja-style obstacle course at England Acres Park. To support healthy eating, we have planted fruit trees at the Wigwam Park which residents are welcome to enjoy, and created a city ordinance allowing for backyard agriculture. To support mental health, the City offers places to be social and gather such as the Community Center on 7th Street, and for years have organized community clean up and neighborhood clean up programs which include use of the Neighborhood Clean Up Trailer and dump trailer at no cost to our residents.

TRASH/DEBRIS:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) states the following will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety.

Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a **YEAR ROUND BULKY WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM** to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website **tooelecity.gov/bulkywaste.** Here are a few basic checklist items:

- You do not have to schedule a Bulky Waste Pick Up, just put your items on your curb the day before your pick up day. Please do not put items on the curb more than 24 hours in advance.
- □ Bulky Waste MUST be bagged, boxed, or bundled (with rope or twine).
- ☐ Tree branches must be cut to less than 5 feet in length and can be no larger than 4 inches in diameter.
- □ Bulky Waste cannot exceed 75 lbs.
- □ Ensure that you do not have unacceptable Bulky Waste materials such as tires, rocks, dirt, sod, oils, paints, construction debris, or hazardous materials.
- □ Call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 if you have questions.

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.


Tree Maintenance

While trees and vegetation contribute to the beauty of our neighborhoods and community, they may also create unintended obstacles and hazards when not maintained properly. Trees that hang over the street or over the sidewalk can create nuisances and in some cases hazards. Please maintain the trees on your property, particularly the trees in the park strips, to make sure your trees are not creating some of these issues:

- Damage to vehicles, particularly large vehicles such as snowplows and garbage trucks;
- Injury to persons;
- Blocked mailboxes;
- Blocked sidewalks;
- Blocked streetlights, markers, and signs.

Fall Yard Cleanup Ideas

Fall is a perfect time to start thinking about getting your yard and trees ready for winter. The right preparation now will save you time and energy when spring rolls around!

- 1. Clean Out Debris—clean up leaves and weeds
- 2. Till the Vegetable Garden—after final harvest
- 3. Trim Rogue Branches—trim large or out of place branches
- Clean Out the Gutters—clear leaves and debris from rain gutters
- 5. Dry Everything Out—drain water from hoses and irrigation lines
- 6. Aerate the Lawn—break up soil so nutrients reach the roots
- 7. Feed the Lawn—add a fall fertilizer
- Rake and Mulch—rake up leaves so they don't suffocate the grass
- 9. Prune Trees and Shrubs—trim dead or overgrown branches
- 10. Give it One Last Mow—set mower to a low setting
- 11. Divide and Cut Back Perennials
- 12. Protect Cold-Sensitive Plants—add mulch to the base
- 13. Plant Bulbs, Shrubs, and Fall Annuals
- 14. Protect the Deck—weatherproof to protect from moisture
- 15. Clean Tools and Store—prevent rust on your gardening tools

TOOELE CITY PROJECTS UPDATE

Infrastructure projects continue in Tooele City this fall. If you have questions about these projects, please call the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this important work!

- ⇒ 100 East 1000 North Traffic Signal: The newest traffic signal went live on Monday, September 16, 2024. This traffic light will improve traffic flow in the area and better prepare the area for future growth and development.
- ⇒ 200 West Road Widening: Utility relocation is scheduled, and plans are underway for the proposed widening on 200 West between 500 North to 600 North.
- ⇒ 520 East 1000 North Traffic Signal: A traffic signal has been warranted and has been approved for construction at this intersection. We anticipate the signal will be installed within the next 6 to 12 months.
- ⇒ <u>All-Way Stops</u>: A new four-way stop was installed at 400 West and 2000 North in late September. Please always be attentive, alert, and use caution when driving.
- ⇒ Berra Boulevard and 2000 North: Old asphalt was removed and replaced with new asphalt at the roundabout and on the south side of 2000 North east of the roundabout to Aaron Drive. New striping and signage will be part of this project.
- ⇒ <u>Cemetery Roads</u>: Several roads in the cemetery were repaired with new asphalt. Gillette Lane, Delamare Lane, Swan Drive, and Atkin Way have all been or will be repaired.
- Droubay Road Widening Project: Construction continues on this project which will include road widening, curb, gutter, sidewalk, lighting, and a walking/biking path on Droubay Road between Vine Street and Smelter Road.
- ⇒ Red Del Papa Parking Lot: The parking lot at the Red Del Papa Baseball Field was improved with a new storm drain and the parking lot was repaved.
- ⇒ Roadwork Projects: There are several cul-de-sacs that are scheduled to be roto-milled and asphalted this fall. Chip seal work should be completed soon on 7th Street, 600 North (east of Main Street), 700 North (east of Main Street), Deer Hollow Road, Elk Meadow, and Oakridge Drive.

The new headworks building at the Water Reclamation Facility (sewer treatment plant) is nearing completion. We anticipate a ribbon cutting and public open house will be held in October/November. Please watch our website tooelecity.gov and our social media sites for more information.





INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2024 YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



As a reminder, Tooele City Code 10-3-6 Snow Event Parking Restrictions reads:

1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:

- (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle;
- (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.

You can receive a civil penalty for parking violations during a snow event. The penalty is \$50 if paid within 15 days, and \$100 thereafter.

STREETLIGHT REPORTING TOOL



We rely on the public to let us know when streetlights are out or not working properly. Please help us by reporting streetlights that are in need of repair.

You can report streetlights that are not working properly on our website, https://tooelecity.gov/streetlight. Find your streetlight on the GIS map, click on your streetlight, and click "Report an Issue".

Some streetlights are maintained by Tooele City, others are maintained by Rocky Mountain Power. You can report any needed repairs to Tooele City and we will coordinate repairs with Rocky Mountain Power.
