This year we are celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the Army. Next year will be the celebration of the 250th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. We have an America250 Committee working on ideas to commemorate America's Anniversary. The purpose of the America250 committee (from the website america250.org) is to "inspire fellow Americans to reflect on our past, strengthen the love of country, and renew our commitment to the ideals of democracy through programs that...foster shared experiences that spark imagination, showcase the rich tapestry of our American stories, [and] inspire service in our communities..."

Just like our nation, our community is better when people foster experiences that spark imagination, showcase our rich tapestry, and inspire service. We have so many examples of service throughout our beautiful town. We have a volunteer fire department. We have people willing to serve as police officers. We have people who donate both time and money to the many causes around Tooele, including the Ritz Theater, downtown events, museums, and safety fairs. We had over 100 volunteers cleaning up the Tooele Valley Museum and Historic Park during #TakePrideTooele Clean Up Day. The Interfaith Council of Tooele County has organized a summer food drive to help the food bank after hearing that the summer months were lean donation and high need months. At the end of the summer, we will have the 9/11 Day of Service, giving anyone who is interested an opportunity to do different projects throughout the City. The Tooele City Council recently adopted the FY26 Budget (2025-2026). The adopted budget was approved with NO TAX INCREASE. The City Council adopted the certified tax rate, which holds to the commitment the City Council made at the beginning of the budget process to not raise taxes this year. You can find a copy of the budget on our website at tooelecity.gov/budget.



In the budget book, you can find department summaries for the 2024 calendar year. The Tooele City Parks and Recreation Department manages a wide range of public facilities, including 15 parks, sports fields, the Pratt Aquatic Center, Oquirrh Hills Golf Course, the Tooele Valley Museum, the City Cemetery, as well as maintaining key City buildings. Recent highlights include the completion of a new Parks & Recreation and Cemetery Office Building, major upgrades at England Acres and Settlers Parks, and the planned planting of nearly 300 trees as part of the City's Tree City USA efforts. Public Works Project Updates

A lot is happening around Tooele City! The following is a brief list of current and upcoming Public Works projects. If you have questions about these projects, or any other projects you see happening in the City, please call the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this important work!

- **200 West Road Widening:** Work on this project will begin this summer. 200 West is being widened and improved from 500 N to 600 N and will include curb, gutter, storm drain, and sidewalk on the west side.
- **2000 North and Aaron Drive Traffic Signal:** A new traffic signal has been designed for this intersection, and we are currently waiting for the necessary parts to arrive. Once the parts are received, installation will begin. Work on this project is expected to start this month.
- **700 North 100 East All-Way Stop:** After a traffic study was completed, it was determined an all way stop is warranted and is now coming soon to this intersection—stop signs will be installed on 100 East in the next few weeks.
- **700 South Waterline Replacement:** We are replacing a 16 inch water transmission line with a new 16 inch transmission line from SR36 to Coleman. Water service in the area may see minimal disruptions — affected residents will be notified in advance.
- **Sidewalk Matching Grant Program:** Tooele City's 50/50 Sidewalk Matching Grant Program is available to eligible property owners who are interested in repairing damaged sidewalks adjacent to their properties. Visit tooelecitey.gov or call 435-843-2130 for more information.
- **Water Wells:** Tooele City remains committed to identifying new water sources to strengthen our water system. We will be drilling two new test wells within Tooele City in the next 6 months.

OUTDOOR WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

2025 Watering Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Please do not water outdoors on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Thank you for your help in conserving water, a precious resource.



The above schedule is a voluntary outdoor watering guide for Tooele City residents. Although this schedule is not mandatory, we ask our residents to follow the voluntary schedule and take steps on their own to conserve water.



INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a **2025 PINK Tooele City ID Badge** on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



NUISANCE WEEDS:

At the March 19, 2025, City Council Meeting, the Tooele City Council approved an amendment to Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a) regarding nuisance weeds. The adopted change removes the previous 6-inch height rule for weeds on properties under one acre—unless a nuisance or hazard is present. Property owners may face fines if their property is not maintained in accordance with City Code. The 6-inch rule is still in effect in all commercial and industrial zoning districts.

Tooele City encourages all residents to be good neighbors by keeping their properties clean and well-maintained. These changes reflect the spirit of code enforcement, which is focused on safety, community pride, and mutual respect among residents.

DRINKING WATER SOURCE PROTECTION

The Tooele City Water Quality Report is available for your review and has been mailed to all water utility account holders within the City. The Report is also available on the City's web page at the following link: http://tooelecit.gov/services/public_works/water/water_quality_reports.php

We are pleased to inform you that your drinking water continues to meet all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and State drinking water health standards.

Tooele City Vigilantly Safeguards its Water Supplies by:

- Establishing drinking water source protection zones for each of the City's sources;
- Adopting City Ordinances and relying on County Ordinances, which regulate potential hazards to the City's drinking water sources; and,
- Collecting and analyzing water quality data to evaluate watershed protection efforts.

How You Can Help:

- Read and follow usage guidelines on detergents, fertilizers and pesticides;
- Do your part to prevent runoff into the storm drain system;
- Properly dispose of household products such as cleaners, oil or gasoline and unused medicines;
- Continue your water conservation efforts; and,
- When you notice someone else contaminating the water, remind them that "We all live downstream."



FLAG DISPOSAL

Bring old, worn flags to Tooele City Hall. There is a flag disposal box in the reception area on the main floor. This will ensure your flags are retired respectfully and properly.


