NOTICE is hereby given that Tooele City will hold a municipal election to elect one (1) **Mayor** and two (2) **City Council Members** for four year terms.

- KEY ELECTION DATES: Primary Election (if needed): August 12, 2025 and General Election: November 4, 2025.
- QUALIFICATIONS FOR A CANDIDATE ARE: (1) Must be at least 18 years old; and (2) Must be a registered voter of Tooele City; and (3) Must have resided in Tooele City for 12 consecutive months prior to the election; and, (4) Must pay the filing fee (\$50 for Mayor, \$30 for City Council Member).
- FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE: All candidates for election are subject to financial disclosure requirements.
- **HOW TO FILE FOR CANDIDACY:** File <u>in person</u> with the City Recorder at Tooele City Hall, 90 North Main Street, Tooele, Utah.
- FILING PERIOD: June 2, 2025 to June 6, 2025 during regular office hours (Filing closes at 5:00 p.m. on June 6, 2025).

Beginning with your June 1, 2025 utility bill, Tooele City will implement updated water and sewer rates. This is the second annual adjustment based on an external rate study adopted in April 2024, which recommended gradual increases over five years due to rising operational costs and the need for critical infrastructure improvements.

We understand that rate increases can be challenging. Please know this decision was made with careful consideration to maintain the efficiency and reliability of your water and wastewater services. Revenue from these rate changes will be utilized for the repair and replacement of aging infrastructure, ensuring long-term sustainability of essential services.

Public Works Project Updates

In addition to managing the City's vehicle fleet, streets, water, sewer, and storm water systems on a daily basis, the following is a brief list of current and upcoming Public Works projects. If you have questions about these projects or any other projects you see happening in the City, please call the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this very important work to our City's infrastructure!

- 200 West Road Widening: Work on this project will begin this summer. The road
 is being widened and improved from 500 North to 600 North and will include
 curb, gutter, storm drain, and sidewalk on the west side of the road.
- 2000 North and Aaron Drive Traffic Signal: A new traffic signal has been designed for this intersection, and we are currently waiting for the necessary parts to arrive. Once the parts are received, installation will begin. Work on this project is expected to start within the next month.
- 2025 Road Improvement Projects: Slurry seal road projects have already been completed for this season. Chip seal projects are slated to begin mid-June. Rotomilling and overlay of new asphalt will begin on Southwest Drive on June 3, 2025. Once work on Southwest Drive is complete, 1000 West—from Utah Avenue to the north end of the road—will then be rotomilled and overlaid with new asphalt.
- <u>520 East 1000 North Traffic Signal</u>: This traffic signal was installed and went live in March 2025. New striping for left turn lanes and new lights with dedicated green turn arrows will be installed soon.
- 700 South Waterline Replacement: Work on this project will take place this summer. We are replacing a 16 inch water transmission line with a new 16 inch transmission line from SR36 to Coleman. Water service in the area may see minimal disruptions — affected residents will be notified in advance.
- <u>Sidewalk Matching Grant Program</u>: Tooele City's 50/50 Sidewalk Matching Grant Program is available to eligible property owners who are interested in repairing damaged sidewalks adjacent to their properties by covering half the cost of approved repairs. The City manages the contractor selection and project oversight, while homeowners contribute 50% of the expenses; participation is subject to funding availability, contractor scheduling, and project eligibility. - <u>Water Wells</u>: Tooele City remains committed to identifying new water sources to strengthen our water system. As part of these ongoing efforts, we currently have bids out to drill two new test wells within Tooele City in the next 6 months.

Recognizing Suspicious Activity

The first rule of crime prevention is to always be alert. Anything that seems slightly out of place or occurs at an unusual time of day could be criminal activity.

- Never attempt to apprehend a suspect or investigate a possible crime on your own. Call the police immediately. Do not worry about being embarrassed if your suspicions prove to be unfounded; law enforcement officers would rather investigate than be called when it is too late.
- Time and accuracy are critical when reporting crime and suspicious events. Call 9-1-1 when reporting life threatening events or crimes in progress, and call Tooele County Dispatch at 435-882-5600 ext. 1 when reporting delayed events or crimes

Due to ongoing vehicle burglary and vehicle theft trends, the Tooele City Police Department would like to remind you of some very important security tips:

- Remember to keep your personal belongings and valuables out of view in your vehicles. It is also important to keep vehicle windows closed and doors locked. Often, stolen items are left in plain sight within the vehicle making them a prime target for thieves. There have also been several reports of unlocked vehicles being targeted, rummaged through, and items stolen.
- Recently, the Police Department has seen an increase in vehicle thefts. Remember, never leave your car running and unattended. Never leave your keys in the car and always park in a well-lighted area, if possible.
- Finally, don't hesitate to report suspicious activity. If you see a suspicious person who appears to be looking in vehicles, or loitering in a neighborhood or parking lot for no legitimate reason, call Dispatch at 435-882-5600.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Please do not water outdoors on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.



NUISANCE ORDINANCE FOR WEEDS:

At the March 19, 2025, City Council Meeting, the Tooele City Council approved an amendment **Tooele** City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a) regarding nuisance weeds. The adopted change removes the previous 6-inch height rule for weeds on properties under one acre-unless a nuisance or hazard

is present. Property owners may face fines if their property is not maintained in accordance with City Code. The 6-inch rule is still in effect in all commercial and industrial zoning districts.

Tooele City encourages all residents to be good neighbors by keeping their properties clean and well-maintained. These changes reflect the spirit of code enforcement, which is focused on safety, community pride, and mutual respect among residents.
