### **STATE OF THE CITY 2025**

On September 17, I had the honor of giving the State of the City address. The following are highlights from that evening. Please visit our website to listen to or read the full address: tooelecity.gov/Mayor

As I near the end of my second term as Tooele City's Mayor, I am proud to reflect on the progress our community has made. Eight years ago, Tooele faced financial uncertainty and tough choices. Today, our City is strong, stable, and ready for the future.

When I first took office, Tooele's finances were on an unsustainable path. Through careful budgeting and strategic decisions—including a necessary tax increase—we have achieved stability. Today, Tooele no longer relies on savings to cover daily operations, and our property tax rate has dropped nearly 26 percent.

The Redevelopment Agency has paid off all debts, including bonds for the 1000 North and Tooele Boulevard roadways and the Tooele Applied Technology College. Transparency remains a cornerstone of our government. Council meetings are live-streamed, budgets are easy to read, and regular updates are shared through newsletters and social media. Honest leadership and accountability guide everything we do.

We continue to invest in our community. Work is underway on the MidValley Highway, including a temporary connection to Tooele Boulevard while we await full state funding. Downtown revitalization through Main Street programs has enhanced building façades, added public art, celebrated veterans, and beautified our City streets. Parks and recreational opportunities have expanded, with major projects like England Acres Phases 2 and 3 bringing trails, playgrounds, dog parks, fitness areas, and lighting for residents to enjoy. Other parks, including Wigwam, Elton, Parker's, and Red Del Papa, have received upgrades to playgrounds, restrooms, irrigation, and parking. Our museums and community centers have also been improved with ADA accessibility updates, new displays, and hands-on educational exhibits to support learning, culture, and social connections.

Public safety has been a top priority. Our Police Department now operates in a modern Public Safety Building and has grown alongside our population, increasing from 36 to 45 sworn officers as our population grew from approximately 34,600 to 41,000. Specialized officers address semi-truck inspections and drug task forces, and new supervisory positions strengthen oversight. Technology improvements include a FARO 3D laser scanner and license plate recognition cameras, while officer safety equipment has been upgraded, including a Mine Resistant Ambush Protected vehicle and new non-lethal tools.

The Fire Department has also expanded, with a new Station #3 and upgrades to Stations #1 and #2. Equipment improvements include SCBAs, radios, hydraulic rescue tools, Engine 26, a brush truck, and command vehicles. Staff now includes a full-time Fire Chief, Deputy Chief, Fire Marshal, volunteer Assistant Chiefs, inspectors, and 55 dedicated volunteers. These investments ensure Tooele remains safe and prepared as our City continues to grow.

Our Public Works Department has completed major improvements to water, streets, sidewalks, and City facilities. We drilled two new culinary wells, replaced aging water lines, and systematically inspected fire hydrants and PRVs. The \$8 million headworks building at our Reclamation Facility has been completed, and design work for future expansion is underway. Roadway and sidewalk projects have included 7th Street, Droubay Road, 700 South, and 200 West, with four new traffic signals and all-way stops at eight intersections.

Mayor Winn's State of the City Address Continued

Equipment upgrades, including GPS tracking on vehicles, street sweepers, camera vans, vac trucks, snow plows, and construction equipment, allow our teams to serve residents efficiently. City services are supported by Finance, HR, IT, and Community Development departments, keeping operations smooth and effective.

Economic growth in Tooele has been remarkable. Industrial companies such as Carvana, Leitner Poma, Central States Manufacturing, Minova, Plastic Ingenuity, and Ashgrove have brought hundreds of jobs to our community. In retail and hospitality, we have welcomed Hobby Lobby, TJ Maxx, Five Below, Ulta Beauty, Chili's, Wingstop, Chipotle, Home2 Suites, and Microtel Inn & Suites. Upcoming projects include Smith's Marketplace, Beans & Brews, Jersey Mike's, Einstein Bagels, Chase Bank, Ross, and Bath & Body Works. Commercial property values have doubled in less than five years—an achievement made without offering local tax incentives.

Tooele thrives through partnerships. We restored the historic Carnegie Library with the Sons of Utah Pioneers and created veteran memorials at Veterans Park, including tributes for Vietnam and Korean War veterans. We have supported homeless shelter programs, local artists, and schools, and continue to collaborate with leaders at Tooele Army Depot and Dugway Proving Ground. These partnerships preserve our history, honor service, and strengthen our community.

Looking ahead, growth will continue to challenge housing, water, and transportation, but Tooele is better prepared than ever. With strong financial footing, comprehensive plans, and a committed community, the future is bright. The progress we've made—in safety, parks, infrastructure, and people—demonstrates that honest, transparent leadership delivers real results. Tooele is a City built on resilience, hard work, and heart, and it remains a hometown we can all be proud of.

The state of our City is strong, and its future is even brighter.

# **Snow Event Parking Restrictions and Winter Weather Reminders**



# Snow Event Parking Restrictions

Tooele City Code 10-3-6(1) states: "10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions"

- (1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:
  - (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,
  - (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.
- (2) Any vehicle parked in violation of this Section may be removed at the discretion of the Tooele City Police Department for creating public safety risks and for obstructing the City's snow removal efforts.
- (3) The following are exempt from this section:
  - (a) Emergency vehicles and personnel in the performance of their functions and duties; and,
  - (b) Tooele City public works vehicles and employees in the performance of their functions and duties.

Do not park your vehicles on the street when snow is falling or when snow or ice have accumulated.

City Ordinances can be found on our website at tooelecity.gov > Our Government > City Code

Snow parking restrictions will be enforced. You may be ticked if you are in violation of this ordinance.

The civil penalty for parking violations during a snow event is \$50 if paid within 15 days, and \$100 thereafter.

Thank you for your help and cooperation!



As the winter months approach, we want to remind you that residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops. This is especially important in areas that are school walking routes! Tooele City Code 4-11-15(1) states: "It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to remove or cause

to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, within 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming."

When the snow falls, don't let our students fall! Please keep all sidewalks that border your property clear, including the sidewalk in your backyard along the street (double frontage)! We need your help especially along school walking routes!

Do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in a roadway or other portions of sidewalks. Tooele City Code 4-11-15(2) states: "It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled snow, ice,

or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic."

Please be courteous to your neighbors, do not blow leaves, snow, or other debris into their yards.

### **ONLINE UTILITY ACCOUNTS**

Tooele City offers several convenient and safe ways to pay your utility bills. Our online utility billing application gives you access to your account 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and is optimized for mobile devices. It is a convenient way to pay your bills on your own time — with no waiting! By paying your bill online you save postage, plus you have instant account access to view real time balances, payment amounts, bill due dates, and detailed consumption history. You can also submit service requests. AutoPay and Paperless Billing options are available but you must go into your account and set up those options. You can also sign up to receive EMAIL or TEXT NOTIFICATIONS to get real time reminders about your utility account!

The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Tooele City is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources, and management strategies to protect each of our drinking water sources. Potential contamination sources common in our protection areas include sanitary sewer lines, septic tanks, roads, residential, commercial and industrial areas, etc. These sources of potential contamination are typically classified as a low susceptibility. Sources which are classified as medium susceptibility include buried fuel storage tanks, accidental spills of potential contaminants, or other similar conditions. The City has developed management strategies to further protect all of our sources from contamination. Please contact the Public Works Department at (435) 843-2130, if you have questions or concerns about our source protection plan.

### **Parks and Recreation Update**

It's been a busy and exciting season for Tooele City Parks and Recreation! We're making great progress on several projects



that enhance our parks, recreation areas, and community facilities.

**Parkers Park Ball Field Lights** – New LED lights were completed on October 24, 2025.

Winn Way at the Tooele City Cemetery - This project is now complete.

**Wigwam Park** – Additional grass has been installed, and permanent ADA-accessible cornhole boards were completed on October 31.

Veterans Restroom - Completed on October 31.

**Glen Eagles Park Restroom** – Expected completion the first part of November.

**England Acres Park** – The basketball court and ninja course are open and ready for use! All turf installation and walking trails have been completed, and more than 100 trees have been planted in the Phase III area. Trail lights are currently being installed, with an estimated completion in January 2026.

**Tooele Community Center** – Construction on new bathrooms began on October 27.

**Pratt Aquatic Center** – New pool toys have arrived, and the leisure pool has been replastered. (See image below.)

**Tooele Valley Museum** – The Foreman's House is now open to the public.


