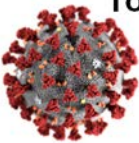

Tooele City CARES Small Business Grant Program



Tooele City is pleased to provide small business grants in an effort to assist local businesses through the COVID-19 hardship. Small businesses are critical to the success of our local economy. The funds originate from the CARES Act fund approved by Congress and passed through the Utah Governor's Office of Management and Budget. Tooele City has determined that these grant expenditures are necessary in response to the public health emergency. Funding will be made available to a limited number of businesses, with 50 FTEs or less that meet specific requirements. Grant awards between \$1,000—\$10,000.

Applications will open on September 8, 2020 at 9:00AM and close on September 18, 2020 at 5:00PM. Funds will be disbursed until the funds are exhausted. Due to the anticipated number of submissions and limited funding, applications will be ranked based on predetermined priorities. 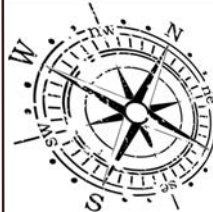

GENERAL PLAN DRAFT

Tooele City is in the process of revising and modernizing our General Plan. The Planning Commission is entrusted by Utah State Law to oversee and guide this process. The Planning Commission has been working for more than nine months on the development of new elements that have become draft of the General Plan. The Commission has held a joint meeting with the City Council to go over the draft and it is now ready for public review and comment. Copies of the draft General Plan are available at City Hall as well as electronically through the City's website at www.tooelecity.org for review and comment. There will also be public open houses to review, discuss, and comment on the Plan scheduled for Thursday, September 17, 2020 and Tuesday, October 6, 2020. These open houses will be held in the City Council Chambers of City Hall from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. There will also be scheduled public hearings before both the Planning Commission and the City Council later in the year. We greatly encourage all interested citizens to participate as you feel comfortable doing so. We want to hear your thoughts on the General Plan as we look into the future for our community. #TakePrideTooeele FALL CLEAN UP

TRASH/DEBRIS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City Code states these will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety. Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a **YEAR ROUND BULK WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM** to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website tooelecit.org. Here are a few basic checklist items:

- ❑ You do not have to schedule a Bulk Waste Pick Up, just put your items on your curb the day before your pick up date.
- ❑ Bulk Waste MUST be bagged, boxed, or bundled (with rope or twine).
- ❑ Tree branches must be cut to less than 5 feet in length and can be no larger than 4 inches in diameter.
- ❑ Bulk Waste cannot exceed 75 lbs.
- ❑ Ensure that you do not have unacceptable Bulk Waste materials such as tires, rocks, dirt, sod, oils, paints, construction debris, or hazardous materials.
- ❑ Call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 if you have questions.

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.

ALL door-to-door salesmen (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a **2020 YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge** on and in plain sight. If a salesperson is not wearing a badge, please call (435) 843-2110 or Dispatch at (435) 882-5600. (We will need a description of the individual along with the direction they are headed). Thank you!
