THE COUNCIL’S CORNER

The Council and Administration recently started budget discussions and will have several more discussions before the final budgets are approved. Adopting the municipal budget is one of the most important tasks of the City Council, ensuring that the Mayor and her staff have the appropriate funds to enable the City to continue to run smoothly while maintaining essential services. One of the ways we have been able to maintain financial stability is by encouraging smart growth and economic development. By fostering a business-friendly environment, we have attracted new businesses to Tooele City. Economic development is essential for alleviating the tax burden on residents. I often come across misinformation about Tooele City’s budget and how the City generates revenue to fund essential services. I’d like to briefly outline two key revenue sources that support Tooele City. This brief outline is sourced from the Tooele City website. For more in-depth information, visit TooeleCity.gov and navigate to the “Government” tab, then select “Budget.”

Sales Tax: Sales tax is the largest source of revenue for Tooele City. Sales tax accounts for approximately 30% of total general fund revenue. The collection of sales tax in the state of Utah is administered by the Utah State Tax Commission, and the distribution formula is determined by the Utah State legislature.

Property Tax: Tooele City’s second largest source of revenue is property tax, which represents 23% of total general fund revenue. Property tax is a much more stable revenue source than sales tax, and thus year-to-year fluctuations in revenue are relatively small. In 2023, Tooele City received approximately 23% of property tax payments with the rest going to Tooele County and the Tooele County School District.

Now that you have a brief overview of two revenue sources, I want to share key takeaways from our recent budget meeting. The Council, Mayor, and staff had an open discussion about funding options for capital projects, additional staffing needs, and the cost to maintain essential services in Tooele City. Many of these projects and staffing needs involve significant upfront and ongoing costs, which often necessitate a tax increase. However, we recognize the financial challenges many in our community are facing, and the Council made a firm commitment to NOT increase property taxes this year.

Fortunately, Tooele City’s strong economic growth and responsible fiscal planning over the past several years have allowed us to maintain financial stability without raising property taxes this year. It’s important to note, that while Tooele City will not impose a property tax increase, other taxing entities—such as the School District and Tooele County—still have the option to do so. We will have additional budget meetings in the coming months before we approve our final fiscal budget in June. Please reach out if you have questions, concerns, or ideas to improve our community. MARCH IS FLOOD AWARENESS MONTH

The potential for flooding could occur at any time. Sometimes, floods develop slowly and forecasters can anticipate where a flood will happen days or weeks before it occurs. Oftentimes, flash floods can occur within minutes and sometimes without any sign of rain. Being prepared can save your life and give you peace of mind. Here are some suggestions from the National Weather Service (<https://www.weather.gov/safety/flood-before>) to make sure you and your family and home are prepared:

CREATE A COMMUNICATIONS PLAN: It is important to be able to communicate with your family and friends in the event of a disaster. Whether it is having a specific person identified to contact for status updates or a safe location to meet up with family members, having a plan in place will give you peace of mind if disaster does strike.

ASSEMBLE AN EMERGENCY KIT: It is good practice to have enough food, water, and medicine on hand at all times to last you at least three (3) days in the case of an emergency. Water service may be interrupted or unsafe to drink and food requiring little cooking and no refrigeration may be needed if electric power is interrupted. You should also have batteries, blankets, flashlights, first aid kits, rubber boots, rubber gloves, and a NOAA Weather Radio or other battery operated radios easily available.

KNOW YOUR RISK: Is your home, business, or school in a floodplain? Where is water likely to collect on the roadways you most often travel? What is the fastest way to get to higher ground? Knowing the answers to these questions ahead of time can save your life.

SIGN UP FOR NOTIFICATIONS: Sign up for TooeleAlerts to receive emergency alerts and notifications. See information below.

PREPARE YOUR HOME:

1. If you have access to sandbags or other materials, use them to protect your home from flood waters if you have sufficient time to do so. Filling sandbags can take more time than you may think.
2. Have a professional install check-valves in plumbing to prevent flood waters from backing up into the drains of your home. Make sure your sump pump is working and consider having a backup. Make sure your electric circuit breakers, or fuses, are clearly marked for each area of your home.
3. Since standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding, ensure coverage by contacting your insurance company or agent to purchase flood insurance. This must be done before there is even a threat of flooding as insurance companies stop issuing policies if there is a threat of flooding (i.e. an approaching hurricane). Many flood insurance policies take at least 30 days to go into effect, so even if you can buy it as a storm is approaching, it may not protect your investment.

PREPARE YOUR FAMILY/PETS: You may be evacuated, so pack in advance. Don't wait until the last moment to gather the essentials for yourself, your family, and/or your pets.

CHARGE YOUR ESSENTIAL ELECTRONICS: Make sure your cell phone and portable radios are all charged in case you lose power or need to evacuate. Also, make sure you have back-up batteries on hand.

LEAVE: If it is likely your home will flood, don't wait to be ordered to leave; evacuate yourself! Make alternative plans for a place to stay. If you have pets, take them with you or make arrangements to board them at a facility well away from the flooding danger.

JOIN TOOELEALERTS

Tooele County is able to send you life-saving emergency alerts via calls, texts, emails, or calls to your home phone with TooeleAlerts, but you must sign up for this service! Alerts may include information about imminent danger such as an active shooter, health hazards, HAZMAT, wildfire, floods, immediate evacuations, major road closures, and major power outages.

Tooele City Project Updates

Public Works



⇒ **2025 Road Projects:** We anticipate that construction will begin this summer. We have a number of streets throughout the City that will be scheduled for chip seal and slurry seal. This year, 1000 West is scheduled for rotomill and overlay. Now that the storm drain was updated last summer, Southwest Drive is scheduled for rotomill and overlay to complete that road upgrade project.

⇒ **200 West Road Widening:** 200 West will be widened between 500 North and 600 North. Construction is anticipated to begin late Spring. This will improve travel safety and accessibility in the area.

⇒ **520 East (7th Street) 1000 North Traffic Light:** Construction has begun and the traffic light will be installed and active soon.

⇒ **All-Way Stop:** A traffic study was completed on the intersection of Coleman and Utah Avenue and was found to warrant an all-way stop. Stop signs will be installed on Utah Avenue soon.

⇒ **England Acres Phase III:** This phase of the park is already underway. Construction will resume weather dependent. This phase includes multi-use grass fields, walking paths and trail, a basketball court, a new 75 stall parking lot, and an X-Treme Ninja Course.

⇒ **Settlers Park:** The playground at Settlers Park was replaced last fall. If you haven't already, check out the newest playground this Spring!

⇒ **Park bathrooms will open the week of March 31, 2025, for the spring, summer, and fall seasons.**

TRASH/DEBRIS ITEMS:

Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner. Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City code states these will be deemed a nuisance: *(b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety;*

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept and must be placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code. Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) of Tooele City code states such vehicles will be deemed a nuisance: *(a) junked, wrecked, or inoperable motor vehicles upon real property, for longer than 72 hours, except that up to 2 such vehicles or parts thereof may be stored within an enclosed building or completely screened by a sight-obscuring fence. (d) Abandoned motor vehicles.*

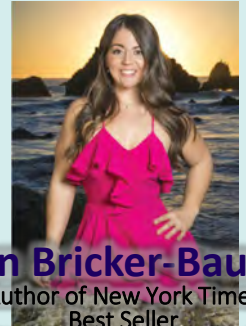
