

MAYOR'S MESSAGE MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

On Saturday, September 13, 2025, our community came together at Tooele Veterans Memorial Park for the 9/11 Memorial Walk. This day provides us with an opportunity to pause, reflect, and honor the lives lost on September 11, 2001—a day that forever changed our nation. We will never forget the innocent lives taken, the first responders who ran toward danger, and the unity that carried our country through unimaginable tragedy.

This year, we were especially honored to spotlight 911 dispatchers, the oftenunseen heroes who coordinate emergency services and support those in crisis. Our keynote speaker was selected to recognize their critical work, and Dispatch Supervisor Lt. Regina Nelson gave a moving reminder of the courage and dedication that occurs on the other end of the line. We congratulate Lt. Nelson on her upcoming retirement after nearly 40 years of service—a legacy of commitment and leadership that will inspire generations to come.



During the walk, each participant symbolically carried the name of one of the first responders who perished in the 9/11 attacks on the World Trade Center, walking in their honor. From the Memorial Park to the Tooele High School football field, residents and first responders alike joined in this mile-long tribute, demonstrating the enduring spirit of remembrance and community.

I am grateful to everyone who participated, and to all who help make our community stronger through service and compassion. We also extend our heartfelt thanks to our first responders-police officers, firefighters, emergency medical personnel, and dispatchers—who continue to protect and serve our community every day. Your courage, dedication, and care make Tooele City a safer, stronger, and more compassionate place for all of us.

As we reflect on this day, let us carry forward the legacy of those we honor. Let us remember the sacrifices, celebrate the heroes, and continue to nurture the unity and resilience that define our community. Together, we ensure that their memory—and the spirit of service they represent—will never be forgotten.

Mark your calendars for the annual Downtown Trick-or-Treat event at City Hall from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m., along Historic Main Street (Utah Avenue to 100 S.) and Historic Vine Street (50 E. to 50 W.). Celebrate National Book Month at the Tooele City Library, which promotes reading, literacy, and the importance of books. Check out activities sponsored by the Tooele City Arts Council, including art classes and events at the Ritz Theatre.

For fall sports, Tooele City's Recreation Department offers youth programs like soccer, flag football, and basketball. High school sports include football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, and golf. Tooele High School's teams are called the Buffaloes, and the new Deseret Peak High School teams are the Golden Eagles.

With the change of seasons and the return to school, it's important to watch for children walking or biking to school and activities. Please recognize the Tooele City Crossing Guards, who help children safely cross streets. When you see a school bus with red flashing lights and an extended stop arm, you must stop completely at least 20 feet away until the bus begins moving.







Trash/Debris:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) states the following will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety.

Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a **Year Round Bulky Waste Pickup Program** to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website **tooelecity.gov/bulkywaste.** If you have questions, call Ace Disposal at 435.882.7009.

Inoperable/Abandoned Vehicles:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-41(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.


Tree Maintenance

While trees and vegetation contribute to the beauty of our neighborhoods and community, they may also create unintended obstacles and hazards when not maintained properly. Trees that hang over the street or over the sidewalk can create nuisances and in some cases hazards. Please maintain the trees on your property, particularly the trees in the park strips, to make sure your trees are not creating some of these issues:

- Damage to vehicles, particularly large vehicles such as snowplows and garbage trucks;
- Injury to persons;
- · Blocked mailboxes;
- · Blocked sidewalks;
- Blocked streetlights, markers, and signs.

Fall Yard Cleanup Ideas

Fall is a perfect time to start thinking about getting your yard and trees ready for winter. The right preparation now will save you time and energy when spring rolls around!

- 1. Clean Out Debris—clean up leaves and weeds
- 2. Till the Vegetable Garden—after final harvest
- 3. Trim Rogue Branches—trim large or out of place branches
- 4. Clean Out the Gutters—clear leaves and debris from rain gutters
- 5. Dry Everything Out—drain water from hoses and irrigation lines
- 6. Aerate the Lawn—break up soil so nutrients reach the roots
- 7. Feed the Lawn—add a fall fertilizer
- 8. Rake and Mulch—rake up leaves so they don't suffocate the grass
- 9. Prune Trees and Shrubs—trim dead or overgrown branches
- 10. Give it One Last Mow—set mower to a low setting
- 11. Divide and Cut Back Perennials
- 12. Protect Cold-Sensitive Plants—add mulch to the base
- 13. Plant Bulbs, Shrubs, and Fall Annuals
- 14. Protect the Deck—weatherproof to protect from moisture
- 15. Clean Tools and Store—prevent rust on your gardening tools



Drive Sober

In 2022, alcohol-impaired driving crashes claimed 13,524 lives nationwide—32% of all traffic-related deaths—averaging nearly 37 preventable deaths every day. Utah's numbers reflect the same devastating trend, with fatalities ranging from 157 in 2021 to 140 in 2024, involving alcohol, illegal drugs, prescription, and even over-the-counter medications (Zerofatalities.com). If it impairs you, don't drive. Plan ahead by choosing a designated driver, avoiding the wheel if your medication causes drowsiness, holding onto keys for impaired friends or family, using taxis, rideshares, or public transit, and reporting suspected impaired drivers. Every life lost is one too many—drive sober.

STREETLIGHT REPORTING TOOL



We rely on the public to let us know when streetlights are out or not working properly. Please help us by reporting streetlights that are in need of repair.

You can report streetlights that are not working properly on our website at https://tooelecity.gov/streetlight. Find your streetlight on the GIS map, click on your streetlight, and click "Report an Issue".

Some streetlights are maintained by Tooele City, others are maintained by Rocky Mountain Power. You can report any needed repairs to Tooele City and we will coordinate repairs with Rocky Mountain Power.
