Tooele City Finance Update

April Bills Are Coming!

April bills are on the way! During the winter months, the City does not read meters in the usual way. Instead, water usage is estimated based on the average consumption at your location from the previous year (November–March).

When the first meter reading of the year is taken in March, bills are adjusted to reflect actual usage. You may see a positive or negative adjustment, which accounts for the difference between estimated and actual water use—either billing for unbilled water or crediting unused units.

Check for High Water Usage

It's important to review your April bill for unusually high consumption, which may indicate a winter leak. High usage can also affect next year's winter water average and your sewer calculation. If you notice higher-than-normal consumption:

- Call us so we can check your meter for leaks.
- Report any leaks repaired over the winter to the Finance Department for a partial account credit.

Sewer Rate Recalculations

Sewer charges are recalculated each year, and your new monthly charge will appear on the April bill. Sewer rates are based on actual water usage during the winter months (November–March). Sewer billing includes:

1. Base fee: \$12.08
2. Usage fee: \$3.45 per unit of water, averaged over the winter months (typically internal household use).

Common reasons your sewer rate may increase

- Change in household members
- Working from home
- Outdoor watering after November 1st
- Leaks inside or outside the home during winter

Equal Pay Recalculations

Customers in the Equal Pay program will see their amounts updated on the April bill. Equal Pay averages actual usage for all services over the past 12 months. Note: Winter meter readings and sewer rate changes on the April bill do not affect this calculation, which covers April 2025–March 2026.

Tips for Equal Pay customers

- Review water usage monthly to quickly spot leaks or other issues. Unnoticed problems can take up to 12 months to appear on your bill, increasing costs and wasting water. Report unusually high usage promptly.

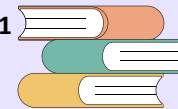

Hydro Resources is on site leading the project, which will help strengthen and support our community's water system.

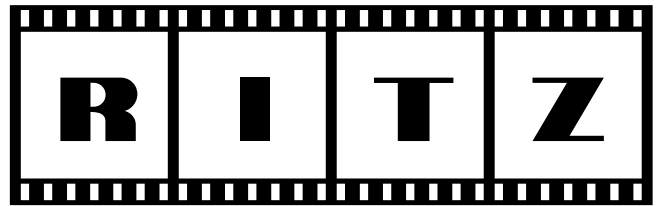
ROAD REHABILITATION

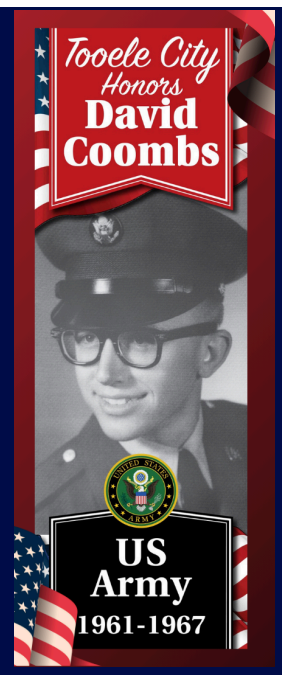
**MILITARY VETERAN

Upcoming UTA Fare & Service Changes

UTA will implement systemwide service and fare updates on April 12, 2026. In addition to routine route and schedule adjustments, several fare changes will affect reduced fare payments and monthly passes.

Key Changes:

- Reduced Fare Payment

Reduced fares will only be accepted with a valid reduced fare FAREPAY Card. Cash, the Transit app, and other payment methods will no longer be accepted.

- Get a Reduced Fare Card

To continue receiving reduced fare, riders must have a qualified FAREPAY Card. Apply online at rideuta.com/reducedfare or visit a UTA customer service location.

- Monthly Passes

Monthly paper passes will be discontinued. Passes will only be available through the Transit app.

These updates are designed to simplify fare payment and ensure riders receive the lowest available fare.

Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code §8-6-13 states "All building sewers, including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner".

Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code §9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box". Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate citizens on this? Check with your homeowners insurance to inquire if your policy covers these types of repairs. There are private companies who offer this type of insurance coverage if your homeowners insurance does not. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Public Works Department at 435.843.2130.

YARD PROJECT IDEAS

- Sweep and tidy sidewalks, curbs, and gutters.
- Mow the lawn and tackle weeds—pull, trim, or treat as needed.
- Remove fallen limbs, branches, and leaves.
- Trim back overgrown bushes, vines, trees, and shrubs.
- Clear out trash, debris, and clutter from your yard.
- Refresh flower beds and borders by cleaning and re-edging.
- Prepare your lawn for healthy growth: rake, aerate, fertilize, and seed.
- Neaten hardscape surfaces like sidewalks, driveways, pathways, patios, and porches.
- Remove obstacles from sidewalks and streets, including overhanging branches or encroaching plants.
- Repair, replace, or paint worn fences and gates.
- Add a finishing touch: plant flowers or greenery to bring color and life to your home!

The Bulky Waste Program is offered year-round for residential customers, and you can take advantage of an extra bulky waste pickup day in May at no additional cost. Please place all items at the curb before 7:00 a.m. on your pickup day, but not more than 24 hours in advance—there's no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule. Some Do's & Don'ts

For this type of pickup, all items must be bagged, boxed, or bundled, and each must weigh under 75 pounds. Bulky Waste will not collect anything marked "FREE," "PLEASE TAKE," or "GIVING AWAY," and items cannot be placed against fences or mailboxes. Please avoid parking vehicles in front of your bulky waste, as blocked items may not be picked up. We ask that you set out your bulky waste the way you would want to pick it up—neat, contained, and easy to handle.

Frequently Asked Questions

When does Bulky Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulky waste pickup program year-round. The pick up day is once a month (based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those times which do not fit into your trash container. This free service helps keep our community clean, and this May you'll receive an extra bulky waste pickup day—check the schedule for details.

Will Bulky Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! Bulky Waste will pick up old appliances (as long as the Freon has been removed and the appliance is labeled), as well as mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulky waste pickup?

Yes! Bulky Waste will pick up yard waste such as branches, limbs, and shrubbery, but everything must be bagged, boxed, or bundled with rope or twine. Branches and limbs must be under 4 inches in diameter, less than 5 feet long, and items cannot weigh more than 75 pounds.

Will Bulky Waste accept hazardous waste?

No. Bulky Waste does not accept hazardous items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides. Please visit tooelehealth.org for details about the Tooele County Health Department's 2026 Hazardous Waste Collection Day on May 16.
