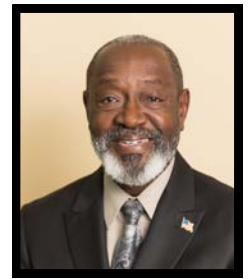

As we move through the final stretch of summer, we hope Tooele City residents enjoyed this year's 4th of July festivities. From the community parade and Hill Air Force Base 'Freedom 250' Flyover to the Bohemian Queen concert and fireworks show, the week was a meaningful celebration of community and country.

Tooele City is proud to participate in America250, the national initiative commemorating the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. This effort encourages reflection on our nation's history and the future we aspire to build together. It also provides an opportunity to reflect on our local and state history, including Tooele City's settlement in 1849 and incorporation in 1853 while Utah was still a territory.

Tooele City operates under a Home Rule Charter, approved by voters in 1965. The Mayor serves as Chief Executive Officer, overseeing daily operations, while the City Council—five nonpartisan members elected at large—serves as the legislative body. Both serve four-year terms.

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at Tooele City Hall, 90 North Main Street. Residents are encouraged to attend and stay engaged.

Tooele City continues to grow stronger through service and collaboration. TooeleServes reflects our shared commitment to strengthening our community—one act of service at a time.

PROTECT YOUR DRINKING WATER!

HELP KEEP YOUR FAMILY'S WATER SAFE



WHAT IS A CROSS CONNECTION?

A cross connection is any link between drinking water and a potential source of contamination.



WHY DOES IT MATTER?

Backflow can allow harmful contaminants into the drinking water system. Preventing cross connections keeps our water safe.

SIMPLE WAYS TO PROTECT YOUR WATER



Install a hose vacuum breaker on outdoor faucets.



Never leave a garden hose submerged in pools, buckets, ponds, or chemical containers.



Avoid attaching hoses directly to faucets without proper backflow protection.



Make sure sprinkler systems have approved backflow prevention devices.



Maintain proper air gaps between faucets and sinks.



Ensure water softeners and other appliances are installed correctly.

We're pleased to report that Tooele City's drinking water meets all state and federal health standards.

How We Protect Your Water:

- Maintain source protection zones for all city water sources
- Enforce city and county regulations to reduce contamination risks
- Monitor and analyze water quality regularly

How You Can Help:

- Follow proper use of fertilizers, pesticides, and detergents
- Prevent runoff from entering storm drains
- Dispose of chemicals, oil, and medications safely
- Practice water conservation
- Remember: *We all live downstream!*

Tooele City Water Consumption Rate Schedule

The Tooele City rate schedule for water consumption promotes conservation for our customers. Water is billed monthly on an increasing rate schedule (provided below).

Water Charges - The water bill charge is a combination of two fees on your monthly billing:

1. Base fee dependent upon meter size.

Size	Base Fee
¾"	\$12.34
1"	\$18.50
1½"	\$27.76
2"	\$37.01
3"	\$46.26
4"-6"	\$55.51

2. Water usage fee per unit (One unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or approx. 750 gallons).

Usage	Per Unit
0-10 units	\$0.80 per unit
11-30 units	\$1.06 per unit
31-50 units	\$1.33 per unit
51-70 units	\$1.59 per unit
71-90 units	\$1.86 per unit
91 + units	\$2.12 per unit

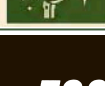

A FRIENDLY REMINDER ABOUT WEEDS:

It's been dry, and that means weeds can quickly become more than just an eyesore — they can pose real fire and safety risks. Tooele City asks everyone to help keep our community safe and looking great by trimming and maintaining weeds and tall grass.

Under Tooele City Code 8-4-4, it's unlawful to allow weeds or grass to grow in ways that create hazards or obstructions, including:

- In public rights-of-way where tall weeds block visibility for drivers or pedestrians.
- On lots under one acre where weeds can become a fire hazard or attract vermin.
- Within 30 feet of property lines on larger parcels (one acre or more), where weeds must be kept under 6 inches.
- In commercial and industrial areas, where weeds taller than 6 inches are not allowed.

Keeping weeds trimmed helps prevent fires, improves visibility, and keeps Tooele looking its best.

Let's all do our part to stay safe and keep our City shining this summer.

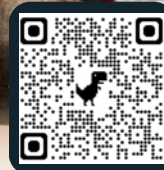
