Together, they work for the well-being of our City.



While trees and vegetation contribute to the beauty of our neighborhoods and community, they may also create unintended obstacles and hazards when not maintained properly. Trees that hang over the street or over the sidewalk can create nuisances and in some cases hazards. Please maintain the trees on your property, particularly the trees in the park strips, to make sure your trees are not creating some of these issues:

- Damage to vehicles, particularly large vehicles such as snowplows and garbage trucks
- Injury to persons
- Blocked mailboxes
- Blocked sidewalks
- Blocked streetlights, markers, and signs





Animal Licenses

It is now Animal License Renewal time for 2026. Please renew your animal license by February 28, 2026. License fees double on March 1, 2026.

All dogs and cats within Tooele City limits and over the age of four months, must be licensed each year. The license renewal application must be accompanied by a current rabies vaccination certificate. License renewal fees may be paid at Tooele City Hall (90 North Main Street, Tooele) in the Finance Department. If you have any questions, please contact the Finance Department at (435) 843-2150.

Renewal Fees:

- Sterilized Dogs* = \$10.00 (\$5.00 for owners ages 60+)
- Unsterilized Dogs = \$35.00
- Sterilized Cats* = \$5.00
- Unsterilized Cats = \$35.00
- Replacement Tags = \$5.00



*Must indicate on Rabies Certificate animal is neutered or spayed or have supporting documentation.

Please include the business license number that is on your business license certificate in the upper left-hand corner under the Tooele City logo. You have through the month of January to renew your license. A 50% LATE FEE will be implemented on February 1, 2026. You will have until March 1, 2026 to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. If you are no longer in business, please let us know by e-mailing businesslicense@tooelecit.gov.
