**SR-36 (Main Street) and Skyline Drive**

**Proposed New Traffic Signal and Raised Median**

Tooele City, in partnership with the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), is proposing a project to construct a raised median along SR-36 (Main Street) from Skyline Drive to just south of 520 South (see map below). The proposed project would also include the installation of a new traffic signal at the Skyline Drive/Main Street intersection, just north of the raised median, along with crosswalks on the north and east legs of the intersection.

These improvements are being proposed as a measure to improve safety and access management at the intersection.

We are holding a Public Hearing to discuss the proposed project and take public comments.

UDOT has completed a Draft State Environmental Study that will be available at the hearing for review.

## March Is Flood Awareness Month

Even though this winter has been relatively dry, the potential for flooding can occur at any time. A single storm, rapid snowmelt, or blocked drainage can quickly create dangerous conditions. Being prepared in advance helps protect your home, your family, and your peace of mind.

Sometimes floods develop slowly, and forecasters can anticipate where a flood will happen days or weeks before it occurs. Oftentimes, flash floods can occur within minutes and sometimes without any sign of rain. Being prepared can save your life and give you peace of mind.

Here are some suggestions from the National Weather Service (<https://www.weather.gov/safety/flood-before>) to make sure you, your family, and your home are prepared:

**Create a Communications Plan:** It is important to be able to communicate with your family and friends in the event of a disaster. Whether it is having a specific person identified to contact for status updates or a safe location to meet up with family members, having a plan in place will give you peace of mind if disaster does strike.

**Assemble an Emergency Kit:** It is good practice to have enough food, water, and medicine on hand at all times to last you at least three (3) days in the case of an emergency. Water service may be interrupted or unsafe to drink and food requiring little cooking and no refrigeration may be needed if electric power is interrupted. You should also have batteries, blankets, flashlights, first aid kits, rubber boots, rubber gloves, and a NOAA Weather Radio or other battery operated radios easily available.

**Know Your Risk:** Is your home, business, or school in a floodplain? Where is water likely to collect on the roadways you most often travel? What is the fastest way to get to higher ground? Knowing the answers to these questions ahead of time can save your life.

**Sign Up for Notifications:** Sign up for TooeleAlerts to receive emergency alerts and notifications specific to our area.

### Prepare Your Home:

1. If you have access to sandbags or other materials, use them to protect your home from flood waters if you have sufficient time to do so. Filling sandbags can take more time than you may think.
2. Have a professional install check-valves in plumbing to prevent flood waters from backing up into the drains of your home. Make sure your sump pump is working and consider having a backup. Make sure your electric circuit breakers, or fuses, are clearly marked for each area of your home.
3. Since standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding, ensure coverage by contacting your insurance company or agent to purchase flood insurance. This must be done before there is even a threat of flooding as insurance companies stop issuing policies if there is a threat of flooding (i.e. an approaching hurricane). Many flood insurance policies take at least 30 days to go into effect, so even if you can buy it as a storm is approaching, it may not protect your investment.

**Prepare Your Family/Pets:** You may be evacuated, so pack in advance. Don't wait until the last moment to gather the essentials for yourself, your family, and/or your pets.

**Charge Your Essential Electronics:** Make sure your cell phone and portable radios are all charged in case you lose power or need to evacuate. Also, make sure you have back-up batteries on hand.

**Leave:** If it is likely your home will flood, don't wait to be ordered to leave; evacuate yourself! Make alternative plans for a place to stay. If you have pets, take them with you or make arrangements to board them at a facility well away from the flooding danger.

## JOIN TOOEEALERTS

Tooele County is able to send you life-saving emergency alerts via texts, emails, or calls to your cell/home phone with TooeleAlerts, but you must sign up for this service! Alerts may include information about imminent danger such as an active shooter, health hazards, HAZMAT, wildfire, floods, immediate evacuations, major road closures, and major power outages.





## A Message from the Tooele City Fire Department

In recent months, our neighborhoods have experienced an alarming increase in residential fires. Most heartbreaking of all is that many of these incidents were entirely preventable. We are reaching out not just to share information, but to ask for your partnership in keeping our community safe. Investigations into these recent fires have revealed several recurring safety concerns. We encourage every resident to review the following fire-prevention reminders:

### 1. Electrical & Utility Safety

- Avoid overloading outlets. Do not plug multiple high-power appliances into a single outlet.
- Use extension cords properly. They should be temporary solutions only—never permanent wiring. Keep cords out from under rugs and furniture.
- Keep utilities accessible. Maintain clear, unobstructed access to electrical panels, solar shut-offs, and gas meters. In an emergency, every second counts.

### 2. Battery & Flammable Storage

- Charge safely. Use only original chargers and avoid charging batteries on soft surfaces like beds or couches.
- Store flammables correctly. Keep gasoline, propane, and solvents in approved containers, stored away from living spaces.
- Dispose of batteries properly. Never throw lithium-ion batteries in the regular trash—they can ignite when crushed.

### 3. Property Maintenance & Defensible Space - The exterior of your home is your first line of defense against fire spread.

- Maintain vegetation. Keep yards, vacant lots, and park strips mowed to 6 inches or less.
- Clear combustible materials. Store firewood, trash, and other combustibles away from structures.
- Address deteriorating conditions. If your home or a neighboring property needs attention, please reach out for assistance. A well-maintained home is a safer home.

### 4. Public Access for First Responders - If a fire breaks out, the Fire Department must be able to reach you quickly.

- Keep hydrants clear. Maintain a 3-foot clearance around hydrants year-round.
- No parking near hydrants. Do not park within 15 feet of a hydrant in either direction.
- Winter responsibility. After snowstorms, please shovel out hydrants near your home.

A fire can destroy a lifetime of memories in under five minutes. Please take ten minutes today to walk your property, check your outlets, review battery storage, and clear potential hazards. Together, we can prevent fires and protect what matters most.

### COMMERCIAL BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS FOR 2026

For those who have not renewed your COMMERCIAL Business License, a penalty fee of 50% was assessed starting February 1, 2026. Please be sure to renew your license! You have until March 15, 2026, to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. If we have not heard from you, your license will be considered inactive and we will close your business after March 15, 2026. You can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Department at City Hall, leave your payment in the Utility Payment Drop Box on the south side of City Hall, or renew your license and make payment online at <https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/tooeleut>.

Please include the business license number that is on your business license certificate in the upper left-hand corner under the Tooele City logo. If you are no longer in business, please let us know in writing by e-mailing [businesslicense@tooelecity.gov](mailto:businesslicense@tooelecity.gov). If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the Business Licensing Office at 435.843.2110.

### BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED IN TOOEELE CITY

Anyone offering a "Service" from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call the Tooele City Business License Specialist at (435) 843-2110 for more information or go to [www.tooelecity.gov](http://www.tooelecity.gov) choose BUSINESS>BUSINESS LICENSES for businesses within Tooele City limits.

### REPORTING SALES TAX

As a reminder, if you collect sales tax in Tooele City, please use Tooele City Sales Tax Code 23048 when filing your taxes.

### DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

All solicitors in Tooele City must obtain a license and visibly wear a **2026 GREEN ID BADGE**. If someone is not wearing a badge, call Dispatch at 435-882-5600. Provide a full description and direction of travel.

## A FRIENDLY REMINDER ABOUT ANIMALS IN CERTAIN PUBLIC AREAS

To help protect public health, food safety, and our drinking water sources, City Code outlines a few locations where animals are not permitted. These rules are in place to keep our community safe and to comply with health regulations.

City Code – Title 6, Chapter 4, Section 5: Places Prohibited to Animals.

1. It is unlawful for any person to take or permit any animal, whether loose or on a leash or in the arms, in or about any establishment or place of business where food or food products are sold or displayed, including, but not limited to, restaurants, grocery stores, meat markets, and fruit or vegetable stores.
2. It is unlawful for any person keeping, harboring, or having charge, care, custody, or control of any animal to allow the animal to be within Zone 1 of any designated groundwater source protection area (within a 100-foot radius of a wellhead or spring collection area).
3. This section shall apply to community cat colonies.
4. This section shall not apply to service animals, as defined.
