We are excited to begin the journey of selecting our new Miss Tooele City royalty.

We are looking for an ambassador, a woman who:

- Is a mature, positive, and professional representative for Tooele City.
- Is a role model to youth in our community.
- Is proud of Tooele and eager to promote our community as a great place to live, work, play, and engage.
- Exhibits patriotism.
- Can meet a demanding schedule during our 4th of July celebration and festivities.
- Is fun, outgoing, approachable, has charm, can interact well with the public, and is comfortable mingling with others in our diverse community.
- Can speak extemporaneously.
- Is an intelligent person who understands patriotism, community, and civic responsibility.
- Is cooperative and will work with the Pageant and Tooele City.

### How to Enter

So now that you can see yourself in this role, your first question may be “How do I enter?” Fortunately, you’re in the right place. This is your Contestant Information Packet, and it will provide you with answers to many of your questions. This packet is organized as follows:

- Contestant Contract – This includes eligibility criteria, commitments you are making, and all the legal information that we must put in place upfront so there are no misunderstandings later.

Additionally, you’ll see on the schedule that we will hold contestant workshops, events, and rehearsals to help tie everything together for you. By the time Pageant day comes around, our goal is that you feel confident, excited, loved, and ready to go!

The selection criteria are as follows:

- **10% Responsibility**  
Meeting deadlines, meeting commitments, following instructions, etc. Everyone starts with a perfect 10. Responsibility score can be reduced for: **Missing deadlines** - 1 point for being late and then 1 point for each additional 24-hour period after the deadline; **Being late** - 1 point for 15 minutes late, 1 ½ points for 15-30 minutes late; 2-3 points for 30 or more minutes late; etc.); **Not attending a required event** - 3-point reduction per rehearsal missed (2-point reduction per rehearsal missed if a representative attends for you and relays all knowledge); or, **Other reasons** deemed to demonstrate responsibility deficiency as compared to the standards expected of Miss Tooele City. Exceptions may be given for advanced arrangements with Director when at the sole discretion of the Director, the reason appears acceptable.
- **25% Interview**  
Private, in person visit with the judges.
- **20% On-stage Communications**  
You will select someone to honor on stage at the pageant by giving a speech (up to 1 minute) about that person. That person will in turn ask you two questions. One question will be taken from your interview and the other will be a random question. We want you to shine so we don't ask tricky or hard questions. They are generally things like ...your favorite...best memory...what xyz means to you, etc.
- **20% Talent/Skills Demonstration**  
We love both traditional stage talents and non-traditional skills demonstrations. Make it entertaining and be confident. Review the information included with this packet for this portion of the pageant. Length is limited to 2 minutes.
- **15% Evening/Formal Wear**  
Review the information included with this packet for the dress & grooming standards.
- **10% Overall Impression & Qualifications**  
A final score is given that takes into consideration your overall qualifications for the position. Judges consider all aspects including the pageant and paperwork you submitted that shows why you want to be Miss Tooele City and your personal information.

All of our judges come from out of town and they bring diverse qualifications and backgrounds.

We are grateful to our Mayor and City Council for their continued support of this special 4th of July event. The Miss Tooele City program would not be possible without them.

CONTESTANT CONTRACT & INFORMATION PACKET

**2026 MISS TOOELE CITY  
SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

**A. I am eligible to compete in the Miss Tooele City Pageant (“Pageant”) because I meet the following criteria:**

1. I am a citizen of the United States of America.
2. I meet the residency requirement as of the date of the Pageant (Verification may be requested):
  - I live, or will live, in Tooele City on the date of the Pageant. I live, or will live, at \_\_\_\_\_;
  - My parent or legal guardian lives, or will live, in Tooele City on the date of the Pageant and I sleep at their home full or part-time due to custodial or other living arrangements. They reside, or will reside, at \_\_\_\_\_; or,
  - I have graduated from high school (or GED) and am enrolled in a higher learning institution and although I live outside of Tooele City to attend to my studies, my permanent residence remains with my parent or legal guardian who lives, or will live, at \_\_\_\_\_.
3. I will be at least 16 and no older than 24 years old on the date of the Pageant. I am not married, nor have I ever been married. I am legally recognized as female. I am of good character and my conduct during the past 12 months is in line with the criteria outlined in the Royalty Code of Conduct attached as Exhibit “F.”  
\*2026 Exception - Teen Age is 15 - 17 years old.

**B. To compete in the Pageant, I agree:**

1. To turn in all required materials by the deadlines and to attend all **Required** events as outlined on the Schedule attached as Exhibit "I" or I will receive a reduction in my Responsibility score.
2. To communicate frustrations or objections productively to the Director. I understand that:
  - a. Any objection to a judge must be presented to the Director within one hour of my interview.
  - b. Requests to re-perform a talent due to a "technical difficulty" (i.e. microphone battery dies, music starts mid-way, stage hand forgot to set out a prop, lights go out),, must be made to the Director within five (5) minutes of conclusion of the original performance.
3. To be cooperative and respectful to all volunteers and to exhibit good sportsmanship and cooperation with other contestants and their supporters.
4. That the decision of the judges in all matters is final.
5. That the documents I provide are government documents subject to the Government Records Access and Management Act (GRAMA). All documents, except the Contestant Information Sheet, are classified as public which means that the documents and information contained in the documents may be released to the public. I acknowledge that the Pageant will release my personal information and biography to the media, to judges, and to others for marketing and promotional purposes.

**C. Commitment I make for my Year of Service if I am selected as Miss Tooele City or a member of the Royalty:**

1. I will maintain residency and all other eligibility requirements as listed above under **Section A** until my successor is selected or appointed, except that if my residency changes after I am selected as a member of the Royalty, Tooele City may waive the residency requirement if, to the best judgment of the Pageant, I am still able and willing to meet all outstanding obligations and appearances as outline in this Contract.

2. If selected as Miss Tooele City, I will serve until my successor is selected or appointed.
3. I will abide by the Royalty Code of Conduct attached as Exhibit "F" and the Dress & Grooming Standards attached as Exhibit "G."
4. I will attend and fully participate in the **Required** events as outlined on the tentative Royalty Schedule attached as Exhibit "I." Miss Tooele City Attendants may be excused from these events by the Pageant Director (generally for school and volunteer related activities). Miss Tooele City is expected to be at all the **Required** events. The Pageant, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to excuse attendance at **Required** events for exceptionally extenuating circumstances such as an important school exam, a scholarship interview that cannot be rescheduled, important school commitment, medical emergency of the contestant or immediate family member, or death in immediate family. Circumstances such as family vacations and social events are generally not considered exceptionally extenuating circumstances. Failure to be excused by the Director will result in a penalty of a \$100 reduction of the awarded scholarship amount. If the awarded scholarship amount is reduced to a \$0 (zero dollar) award, this may result in forfeiture of the right to any title, and all awards/prizes/scholarships.
5. If selected as Miss Tooele City, I will not participate in any other local, state, or national pageants unless it is a school/college pageant with no franchise affiliation AND I will provide proof that it will not interfere with the responsibilities/duties of Miss Tooele City.

If selected as an attendant, I may participate in other pageants and may hold multiple attendant titles/positions (i.e. runner-up/attendant), if allowed for by other pageant system. I will relinquish my Miss Tooele City attendant status within 72 hours, if I am selected to hold another title, except for a school/college title with no franchise affiliation or conflict of interest. I may serve as an attendant in another pageant system if I can still fulfill my commitments to the Miss Tooele City Program.

6. I understand that I am and will remain a volunteer with respect to my relationship with the Miss Tooele City Program and Tooele City and am not an employee thereof; that the provisions of this Contract and other agreements are only intended to permit the Pageant to act in my place and stead with respect to the contracts and arrangements described therein as a matter of convenience and organization but not for the purposes of directing my performance or controlling my activities as if I were an employee.
7. I know I may incur costs pertaining to travel, food, or other unknown expenses and that Tooele City is under no obligation to reimburse me for such expenses, whether known or unknown.
8. I am responsible for my own insurance coverage (health and car, and/or liability) during that time that I will be representing the Pageant or Tooele City; however, Tooele City may choose to provide me with worker's compensation insurance when volunteering at approved Programs and/or activities in an official capacity consistent with the Utah Government Volunteer Worker's Act and Tooele City's worker's compensation insurance policy.
9. I agree to return my crown/tiara & banner within 72 hours, and will forfeit my scholarship, if I relinquish or have my title of Miss Tooele City or an attendant revoked.

**D. Release and Indemnity Agreement:**

1. I recognize and accept that my participation is the Miss Tooele City Program and Pageant ("Pageant" for purposes of this Release) may involve physical injury and emotional stresses to myself. I hereby voluntarily and intentionally release Tooele City, and its officers, employees, and volunteers ("City Indemnitees") from all claims related to my participation in the Pageant, including claims for the negligent acts and omissions of the City Indemnitees. In addition, I agree that I or my insurance company will pay for medical, hospital, and any other expenses resulting from my participation in the Pageant. By signing this Contract, including this Release, I acknowledge that I have read this Release, that I understand this Release, and that I agree to the terms of this Release.
2. I authorize the use of any photo(s) I submit to the Pageant for advertising and any other purpose or purposes as a participant at the Pageant. This provision shall survive termination of this Contract.

3. I authorize the Pageant to take photograph(s) or audio or video recordings of me individually or in a group and to use or reuse such in all mediums and to use my name, likeness and/or physical depiction for any purpose in perpetuity, in an unedited or edited manner. All Photographs, video recordings, audio recording, or other recordings or reproductions made of me, be they "still" or "live" as a contestant in the Pageant, or as a participant in the events leading up to the selection of Miss Tooele City either individually or as a member of a group, become and remain property of the Pageant in perpetuity and some may be used and re-used for publicity, advertising or any other proper use. This provision shall specifically survive termination of this Contract.
4. This Contract and the Exhibits shall solely and exclusively determine my rights, privileges, and responsibilities to the Pageant and no oral or other written statement shall be binding.
5. Should any provision of this Contract be voided or unenforceable, such provision shall be deemed omitted and this Contract, with such provision omitted, shall remain in full force and effect.
6. I agree that my services are extraordinary and unique and that there is no adequate remedy at law for a breach of this contract by me, and in the event of such a breach or attempted or threatened breach, the Pageant will be entitled to equitable relief by way of injunction or otherwise.
7. If I have made untrue statements regarding this Contract or fail to meet any requirements, I understand the Pageant will proclaim this Contract null and void.

E. **Notice of Right to Consult with Legal Counsel**

I have had full and adequate opportunity to be thoroughly advised of the terms and conditions of this Contract by counsel of my own choosing.

F. **Contestant Signature**

## EXHIBIT “B”

### TALENT/SKILLS DEMONSTRATION INFORMATION & REQUEST SHEET

The following rules apply to talent/skills demonstrations:

- Two minute length limit. If over this limit, your request may be denied or your Responsibility score reduced.
- Must be performed on the stage only.
- No talent duplication. If two contestants request the same music—the contestant providing all entry and required talent information first gets priority.
- Accompaniment should be music that is in karaoke format (for vocal talents no one can be singing on it unless it is only de minimis background vocals). Live accompaniments are not allowed.
- Video or other recorded elements or presentations are allowed only if this is the most reasonable and feasible method to demonstrate a talent. Video or other recorded elements that, in the opinion of the Pageant, primary accentuate a stage performance or show a secondary talent will generally not be allowed.
- Talent/Skills Demonstration must have a live, on-stage element (i.e. if you are showing a video, you must speak about it and remain on the stage for the duration of the showing).
- Generally, only the contestant will be allowed on stage during her performance. However, there are circumstances where one (1) partner or assistant will be allowed on stage if essential to perform the talent and no other reasonable methods are available (i.e. ballroom dancing generally requires a partner v. lyrical dancing can be performed without a partner; softball demonstration may need someone to catch the ball v. a singer does not need back-up dancers/vocalists.) Additional individuals may be permitted on stage if solely for safety.
- No talents/skills demonstrations may have dangerous elements to the contestant or public (i.e. knife throwing, high wire, weapons, fire, fall potential greater than 3 feet may be deemed dangerous, etc.)
- No inappropriate language, sexual, or other content that has the potential to be offensive to an audience or family friendly event, in the sole discretion of the Pageant director.
- Contestants enter stage left and exit stage left.
- Lighting will be full stage lights.
- Microphones may be held or on a stand. Body or lapel microphones are not available.

You will need to provide the following:

- Music must be submitted by the deadline, **cut to appropriate length, and in .mp3** format to avoid reduction in Responsibility score.
- Video or other recorded presentations, must be submitted by the deadline, **no larger than 2GB, and in .mp4 format** to avoid reduction in Responsibility score. The Pageant makes no guarantee or warranties that computers, projectors, software, or other electronic resources will be available or functional. This responsibility falls with you and is part of your overall talent performance. Double check equipment. Contestants may be required to provide their own operator to run the video performance. Contestants may be required to provide their own projector, cords, and other materials necessary to show the recording.
- Any copyright or release agreements, if applicable.



## EXHIBIT "C"

### PHOTO

Your photo is used for marketing, the program book, and is included in the judging packet. Make sure you love it, that it is an accurate reflection of you, and that it is good quality. Make a great first impression!

To avoid having points deducted from your Responsibility score, all contestant photos must be:

- Turned in by deadline
- Digital
- Color
- Head and shoulder shot only
- **Portrait**, not landscape
- Of high quality that can be sized to 8x10
- If photo is a professional portrait, you need to provide a copyright release authorizing the Pageant to use the photo for Pageant purposes including in the local newspaper, on the City website, and in the official Pageant program book. This is your responsibility to obtain and must be submitted with paperwork.
- Delivered on a labeled flash drive with no other file on it OR e-mailed to: Kami Perkins at [kamip@tooelecity.gov](mailto:kamip@tooelecity.gov) with the subject line: Miss Tooele City Contestant photo and your name.

A few pointers:

- Use a high-quality camera
- Take your photo in front of a solid color background that contrasts with your hair color, if possible.
- Avoid scenery, props, busy backgrounds, etc.
- High contrast in colors is suggested
- Use good lighting
- If you are struggling to get a good photo, let the Pageant know and we may be able to help you here at City Hall



## EXHIBIT "D"

### ON-STAGE PRESENTATION SKILLS IN PATRIOTIC PARTY WEAR

### *"America 250 - Life, Liberty, & the Pursuit of Happiness!"*

The name and contact information for your honoree is due by **the deadline outlined on the schedule** to avoid reduction in your Responsibility score.

This year's 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration theme is "**Celebrating America 250!**" and we are honoring individuals who represent the principles of Life, Liberty, & the Pursuit of Happiness. As part of the On-stage Presentation competition, you will select an individual who is somehow reflective of the theme and who you feel is deserving of public recognition. You will introduce him/her to the audience and give a brief speech that is your tribute to this individual as it relates to the theme. **Your speech should not exceed 60 seconds.** You may carry an index card with you on stage and reference it as needed (i.e. bullet points or facts).

The honoree will in turn ask your on-stage question(s). Be sure that he/she can read the index card. The pageant will write the questions and provide them to the guest approximately 20 minutes prior to when they need to read it. Please do not allow your honoree to tell you the questions ahead of time.

Your honoree is encouraged to wear nice clothing and should be instructed to meet at the East door to the auditorium by 6:30 p.m. on pageant night.

Select your *honoree* using the following guidelines:

- On the day of the pageant, should be living, working, or regularly visiting Tooele City.
- No age limitation but the person should be able to ask your on-stage questions (accommodation may be considered at the discretion of the Director).
- If you would like to honor a group you may do so but should only select one person to represent that group on stage unless extenuating circumstances exist (i.e. one of the kids is disabled or elderly, etc.).
- For this year only, we are allowing you to honor a member of your immediate family.
- Select someone who you are comfortable talking about on stage and introducing to the community.
- Select someone who will be comfortable coming on stage with you, allowing you to speak publicly about him/her, and who can/will be able to read your on-stage questions to you. If the person you select cannot read the questions, someone else may come on stage to assist.
- Select someone who is reflective of the theme.

**Have fun with this part of the competition.  
It is a great way for you to pay tribute to  
someone worthy in our community!**

#### **SOME IDEAS**

- A long-time friend who has made an impact on your life
- A friend who has overcome a special trial
- A friend who has been uplifting and inspirational to others for various reasons
- A friend who has made an impact on the school, community, or others
- A family member who has served in the military
- A family member who has made an impact on the community
- A family member who has achieved a special life milestone
- Someone who exemplifies freedom
- Someone or a group you always remember that made the 4th of July parade or activities special

Note: Parents are undoubtedly deserving of honor, but judges will be looking for choices that go beyond the obvious. If you choose to honor a parent, make sure your reason truly stands out and reflects something exceptional.



## EXHIBIT "E"

### SCHOLARSHIP RULES

1. The scholarships are up to \$1,999 for Miss Tooele City (if reimbursed; otherwise, the amount may be taxable) and \$1,000 for each co-attendant. In the event of a change in the number of members of the royalty selected due to participant numbers, the scholarship amounts may be changed and contestants will be notified in advance.
2. Scholarships may be reduced/pro-rated due to lack of fulfillment(s).
3. Scholarships are to be used for the contestant winner only (i.e. member of the Royalty). They cannot be used on behalf of another family member, friends, charity, etc. They cannot be donated or assigned.
4. Scholarships become available to the Royalty following completion of their Year of Service (i.e. crowning new royalty for the next year) but may be used for eligible expenses incurred during the Year of Service. All requests for scholarship reimbursements must be made within two (2) years from the date they are made available to the Royalty. After that time, scholarship reimbursements not yet requested are forfeited.
5. Scholarships are paid as a reimbursement. Scholarships are to be used to defray expenses relating to pursuit of academic advancement. For example, reimbursements may be requested for:
  - High school fees directly related to academic advancement and purposes above and beyond basic established fees such as AP class fees, concurrent enrollment fees, college preparation or admission testing, or specialized academic course fees.
  - Accredited and registered in the State of Utah private school tuition fees.
  - Technical college fees such as testing, admission, tuition, books, and supplies required.
  - Books and materials required for academic classes and when substantiated by syllabus or other school-provided documentation.
  - A computer, tablet, or other similar mobile devices are customarily needed for education purposes and supporting hardware (but not a phone).
  - Room and board while enrolled and attending a college, university, or technical college at least half time.
  - Professional academic support (i.e. tutoring) when supported by a brief written recommendation (email or letter) from a teacher, counselor, or school administrator, stating that tutoring is recommended for the student's academic success in a specific subject area.
  - Specialized equipment or software required to accommodate a student's documented disability when supported by documentation of need or recommendation such as a copy of the student's IEP (Individualized Education Program), 504 Plan, or a Letter of Medical Necessity from a license professional. The equipment or software must be for educational use and not a personal medical device (e.g., hearing aids, glasses, etc.).
  - Other expense reimbursement requests may be considered by the Director, with approval from the Mayor.
6. Requests for scholarship payment are to be submitted to the Director with supporting documentation.
7. Scholarship payments will be made payable to the contestant winner only, not to parents or other third parties. Payments will generally be processed within 30 days after the Pageant receives the necessary documentation.



## EXHIBIT "F"

### ROYALTY CODE OF CONDUCT

As a member of the Royalty, you will be expected to uphold and maintain the dignity and honor of the Program both in your ***official*** capacity and your ***personal*** capacity. We believe that we can best meet these expectations by establishing some basic Code of Conduct standards. While this is not an exclusive list, it provides the minimum standards of conduct expected of the Royalty. Your signature on the Contract indicates you agree to:

1. Not engage in conduct that has the potential to discredit or bring the Program into disrepute.
2. Represent Miss Tooele City with high moral character and not engage in acts of moral turpitude.
3. To behave accordingly as a good role model and upstanding citizen that follows the law;
4. Respect and protect the crown, banner, and other insignia and ensure it is not misused by yourself or others.
5. Not use, make, store, sell, or distribute illegal drugs, or misuse prescription drugs.
6. Not smoke, vape, or use tobacco or other harmful substances.
7. Not violate the following regarding alcohol:
  - Whether of legal age or not, while in your ***official*** capacity or ***while wearing the crown/banner*** - at no time consume alcohol, give the appearance that you are consuming alcohol, simulate consumption of alcohol (i.e. posing with a can to your mouth that at first glance may appear to be alcohol), be photographed with alcohol or what looks like alcohol in your hand, or engage in activities that could be construed as promoting alcohol consumption.
  - Not engage in underage consumption of alcohol.
  - If age 21 or older, not consume alcohol or give the appearance that you are consuming alcohol at public events where you have, or will, appear with the Royalty (i.e. Introduced at the County Fair and may therefore, not later consume alcohol at fair events – On the Arts Festival schedule to perform and may therefore, not later hang out at the beer garden).
8. Not engage in any activity that could be viewed as violent, abusive, hostile, discriminatory, or harassing.
9. Not use foul or vulgar language, nor engage in foul or vulgar body actions.
10. Not use social media irresponsibly and refrain from social media activities that have the potential to reflect negatively on Tooele City or the Miss Tooele City Program.
11. Not take, distribute, or post any photos of yourself or others that could be deemed questionable, including but not limited to, scantily or minimally clothed, or provocatively posing.

Exceptions obviously apply for legitimate reasons such as a theatrical performance or similar purposes. Please notify the Director if this will apply to you.



## EXHIBIT "G"

### **DRESS & GROOMING STANDARDS**

While representing Miss Tooele City in your *official* capacity (i.e. while wearing the crown or banner, at appearances & events, in photos, etc.), it is important that you exhibit an image that is representative of the Miss Tooele City Program.

Fashion and style are important! However, the Miss Tooele City Program is sponsored by Tooele City and other contributors and as such, our Program needs to appeal to an audience with diverse ages, values, cultures, and professional expectations. We believe that we can best meet this goal by following some basic standards:

#### **Community Events, Office, Professional Appearances, and Similar:**

1. No visible cleavage; necklines should cover the breast.
2. No bare midriffs (keep the tummy covered).
3. No underclothing may be showing (please be very careful with low rising pants).
4. No clothing that advertises, promotes, or glorifies the use of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or other illegal substances.
5. Skirts and shorts should be no shorter than 4 inches above the top of the kneecap; shorts should not be worn to indoor events.
6. Shirts should have a minimum of a 1-inch upper seam on top shoulder and snug fitting under arm; avoid spaghetti-strap shirts; shifts must have at least one shoulder strap that is a minimum of a 1-inch upper seam on the top shoulder or a halter style; no strapless or completely backless shirts.
7. All jewelry/piercings anywhere on the front of the face or inside the mouth must be completely removed.

#### **Parades, Hosting Events, Evening Wear, Talent Performances, and Similar:**

1. Be classy and use good judgment in selecting attire that is appropriate for the audience and event; what you would wear to an outdoor appearance is not always appropriate for an indoor appearance.
2. Be aware that some parades have dress code standards. You may need to modify a dress or wear an accessory to comply with these requirements.
3. The Pageant frowns on plunging necklines, extremely high cut slits (i.e. to top of thigh), and extremely low backs (i.e. down to the bottom).
4. All jewelry/piercings anywhere on the front of the face or inside the mouth must be completely removed (exceptions may be granted when consistent with the costume for a talent performance).

The Pageant reserves the right to require certain attire, colors, or overall style at any appearance. If something is not addressed above, the Miss Tooele City Program reserves the right to ask any member of the Royalty to change attire.

**MISS TEEN ADDENDUM**

Official title will be "Miss Teen Tooele City - America 250 Ambassador." She will serve as a member of the Miss Tooele City Royalty.

- The Miss Teen Tooele City - America 250 Ambassador will be equivalent to an attendant for contractual obligations, appearance priority, promotion, and other purposes.
- Special solo appearances as Miss Teen Tooele City - America 250 Ambassador may be scheduled or authorized by the Director.
- Photo will not go on wall at City Hall and likely will not be the cover of the 2027 pageant.
- Due to age and risk management requirements, some events may require special parental permission, parental chaperone, or inability to participate.
- Scholarship amount and administration for Miss Teen Tooele City - America 250 Ambassador will be commensurate with attendant value and rules as outlined in the Miss Tooele City Contract.
- Miss Teen Tooele City - America 250 Ambassador can compete for Miss Tooele City again the following year and thereafter, if eligibility is met.
